The Pearl

Doug's Discussion

Hidden Hate is Still Hate

I don't suppose anyone, no matter how good-natured, has gone though their whole lives without having a problem with someone. (Although, in this case I would love to be wrong.) Maybe the other person did something truly nefarious to offend you. Maybe their personality irritates you. What is the best way to respond? Option one: you confront the person and show them what they have done to upset you. Option two: you are able to truly let it go. Option three: you, unwilling to confront the person, shove that offence deep down into your heart. There it festers and grows from irritation to hatred. But you know it's not right for a Christian to hate so you hide it and pretend everything is fine.

Personally, I think it's best to let a lot of things go. If you're offended by everything the problem probably isn't everybody else. I just offended you didn't I? Well . . . I'm just trying to help you out. But, if you're not able to let it go, I strongly recommend you to speak to the person you have a problem with. "If your brother or sister sins, go and point out their fault, just between the two of you" (Matthew 18:15). It's difficult, but in the long run you'll be better off.

I've heard a lot of people say something like "God commands you to love people, but He doesn't say you have to like them!" I am uncomfortable with this statement. (Sorry if I just offended you again). If you mean that you're going to make the effort to love people who you aren't currently getting along with I think that's great. But I don't think that's what people who say this really mean. It sounds like option three to me. I'm going to say I love you – because I know I should. But secretly, deep down, I'm storing up all the things about you that aggravate me. But – I'm not going to hide it perfectly, because no one can keep what it is in their heart from spilling out of their mouths. Before you think that's okay, consider this proverb: "He who conceals his hatred has lying lips. Whoever spreads slander is a fool" (Proverbs 10:18).

I'm going to try and help you out by being someone who is easy to get along with. But – I don't always succeed in this. Will you forgive me and let it go? That would be nice. I really am

trying. But, if not, would you come talk to me? I'd be happy to try and make things right. But what I ask you don't do is harbor secret resentment that leads, in weak moments, to you speaking poorly about me to others. I don't want to hear those negative things you have to say about other people either. Concealed hatred is still hate.

I read a children's story once about wooden people who spent all day putting stickers on one another. If one did something impressive they would get a star. But when a little wooden person made a mistake they would get a dot. It was all well and good for the talented, attractive ones. They would glitter with their many stars. But the clumsy ones with peeling paint were regularly discouraged when they were given yet another bad mark.

This clever story makes a good point. Our words tend to stick. People can end up carrying around what other people say about them for a very long time. Perhaps that's why the Bible says: "do not let any unwhole-some talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen" (Ephesians 4:29). Why not choose to say what is encouraging? There are too many people in this world giving out too many dots. Don't be one. Use the stars instead.
