

SIN IS DEADLY

It was 1987 in Brazil, some children who were playing in a junkyard found a silver metal container. Someone cracked it open to reveal the most exquisite blue, round blob nesting inside. It was different from anything they had ever seen. It glowed even in the daylight!

Before long, a crowd had gathered to look at the glowing ball. Everybody wanted to hold this odd substance. One man dipped his finger in it and wrote his initials on his bare chest. Another couple of people played catch with it like it was a ball. Another man worked the pliable ball into various shapes while the crowd around him laughed.

Later that day, strange symptoms began to appear on the bodies of all the people who had touched the blue blob. Each person began to feel chilled, feverish, and generally weak. Every bit of skin that had come into contact with this glowing glob had burn marks. Within 24 hours the man who had written his initials on his chest had deep burns etched into his skin.

After some investigation, it was discovered that the canister had been stolen from an abandon hospital and sold to the junkyard. The contents had at one time been used to save lives by treating cancer. The highly radioactive material was never intended to be touched by human hands. As I read this story, I could not help but think how this incident with the radioactive material is much like sin. Humans were not designed to deal with it, yet we see in Gen. 3 that Adam and Eve, along with Satan introduced sin into our world. Now people are fascinated with sin's pleasure, gratification, and excitement just as those people in Brazil with the radioactive material; yet not knowing what they were playing with. Then disaster hits those who continue to play with sin, they get the disease, a broken relationship, a lost job, or hundreds of other ill effects. Rom. 6:23 tells us that the ultimate problem with sin is that it causes spiritual death.

Rom. 6:23 continues and reminds us that Jesus Christ came to rescue us from our sin and gives us eternal life. Jesus had to give His life for us by dying on the cross for our sins. "In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace" (Ephesians 1:7).

God will save and give eternal life to those who place their faith and trust in Jesus (Acts 16:30-31), turn from their sins in repentance (Acts 17:30-31), confess Jesus before men (Romans 10:9-10), and are baptized (immersed) into Christ for the forgiveness of sins, this is where we begin our new life in Christ and die to sin (Rom. 6:1-6). Christ will continue to cleanse us from sin as we continue to walk in the light of His Word (1 John 1:7).

Sin like radioactive material is dangerous, lets follow Jesus so we will not suffer from eternal death. Think about it!

Doug's Discussion

Looking for Loopholes

The people of Gibeon tricked the Israelites. Even though they lived nearby they made Joshua believe that they lived very far away. "Then Joshua made a treaty of peace with them to let them live, and the leaders of the assembly ratified it by oath" (Joshua 9:15). Now, I'm not privy to every word that was said in this sworn treaty but it looks like it was basically "we promise not to kill you." And then they smacked their own foreheads later because they soon realized someone pulled a fast one on them.

But what if someone else would do the job FOR the duped Israelites? It just so happens that the Israelites were in luck. The five kings of the Amorites were not big fans of this treaty. They assembled their forces and go march against Gibeon to make them . . . less alive. So Gibeon goes to beg Israel for help. And do you know what Joshua could have said? Something like "hahahahahaha!" Then he could explain, "listen, WE promised not to kill you even though you are taking up the land God gave us. But they are not us. Good luck! We'll come to finish them off after they have worn themselves out fighting you." Of course, if you know the story you know that's not what happened.

Why didn't Israel just let the Gibeonites die? That could have made life easier for the Israelites for generations. Perhaps their rescue came at the command of God, who used the situation to defeat the armies of the Amorites. Perhaps also Joshua realized using someone else to do your dirty work doesn't mean you failed to "let them live." Remember that David didn't kill Uriah himself, he just put him in a situation that was very likely to lead to pointy things headed Uriah's direction. But that didn't stop God from saying "You killed him with the sword of the Ammonites" (2 Samuel 12:9).

If you want to be a champion of what is right (like Joshua was) you have to take some responsibility for what happens – even if your hand is not the one doing the deed. How many times have we just shrugged and said "well it wasn't me"? Maybe not, but can you help? Can you prevent what is unjust? Can you make something right? Will you refrain from attempting to get out of a promise because of the way it was technically worded? Doing what is right is not compatible with searching for loopholes and shirking responsibility. I think Joshua knew that. Do we?

Bíble Call Update

We had 356 Calls in March which represents over 44 hours of Bible teaching via the phone. The highest day was March 2 with 24 calls. The most listened to lessons 111 Loneliness and What To Do About It (19), 652 The Rapture (17), 110 Overcoming Worry (15), 115 Overcoming Depression (12), 407 Divorce and Remarriage (9), 121 Facing the Storms of Life (8). We continue to have requests for Bible Studies and for leaflets to be sent to sister congregations. 600 leaflets were sent to a small congregation in Texas. We provided the information so a congregation in VA can print their own leaflets. We have mailed 5 carrier routes in Parkersburg in April.

If you are willing to mail the carrier route you live in or help with funds to mail more of Wood County at this time let me know. Carrier routes are between 500 – 600 homes and that costs about \$165 to process. At this time when people are confined at home and more open to searching for answers would it not be good to double up our efforts. -- David Epler
