A.M. Sermon with Doug Wells The More You Give the Richer You Are

lext: 2 Corintnians 9:6-8
Receiving gifts can be fun. But would you consider yourself a good giver? Look at 2 Corinthians 9:8 – why did God give to you?

Doug's Discussion

Defining Moments

I think we can all acknowledge that not every moment in our lives has the same weight. Some are more consequential than others. When it comes to long reaching impact on my life that time I asked Raeanne (now my wife) for her number was much more important than my cereal choice that morning. Do you see what I mean? Some moments are huge.

Think about the characters in the Bible. Many of them are basically defined by one or two moments. What do you think of when I say Zacchaeus? Probably that he climbed up a tree, right? That's because that day had such a huge and positive impact on his life. This can go the other way too. King Saul's life was defined by failing to obey the Lord's command in the battle against the Amalekites. God gave him clear instructions and Saul decided he'd rather enjoy some tasty sheep than obey. That moment marked the beginning of the end of his kingdom . . . and eventually his life. Samuel informed him from the grave "Because you did not obey the Lord or carry out his fierce wrath against the Amalekites . . . The Lord will hand both Israel and you to the Philistines, and tomorrow you and your sons will be with me" (1 Samuel 28:18-19). How things could be different if Saul had been wiser in that monumental moment!

I pray we all have the wisdom to see when we are in one these moments. There are times and places that are a crossroads. Our life can go very differently depending on which road we choose. May we choose well! When Moses struck the rock instead of speaking to it that moment changed his retirement plan. When David didn't keep his eyes to himself while on the roof it caused death and destruction throughout his family tree for decades. But when Nathanael took up Philip's invitation to "Come and see" (John 2:46) it led to faith in Jesus and presumably (Scripture gives us no indication he ever turned away from the faith) to eternal life. When you are wavering back and forth on whether you will follow God's will or your own I think that is a big moment. Which road will you choose? Choose well. The two destinations are very different.

Let us keep up the good work of calling and telling others about Bible Call program. We had 303 calls in April. This represents 30 hours of teaching via this means.

The high days were April 6 (16), April 9 (22) and April 20 (20). Lessons called 9 times "Overcoming worry" 110, called 6 times 111, 112, 121, 326, 652, 651, 653- "Loneliness and What To Do About It", "God's Answer for Guild", "Facing the Storms of Life", "A Way This is Right and Cannot Be Wrong", "The Rapture", "When Jesus Comes Again", and "The End of the World."

12 times people listened to the same lesson again.

We mailed four routes in April and continue to process those who are active in Bible course.

The Steelton congregation in New Martinsville is working on mailing their area two times next year, and I am helping them get this set up.
