

Bíble Call Update

We had 208 Calls in May with Bible Call. This represents 23 hours of Bible teaching on the phone lines.

High calls were for lessons 126: The Secret of Contentment, 122 How to Help Yourself Become Better, 325 How Can Man Be Justified with God?, 601 When and Where Did the New Testament church Begin, 556 Instrumental Music in Worship, 650 Life After Death, 951 The Kingdom and 1000 year Reign, 602 Why are There so Many Different Churches?, 304 Are We Saved by Faith Only? 124 Take a Look At Your Honesty. 112 Gods Answer for Guilt, 111 Loneliness and What to Do About It.

As you see there is a great variety in peoples' interest. We continue several studies by Bible correspondence. I usually start people on the Topical Study by Freeman and then the Survey of the Bible in 30 lessons. From there we use the Study of Acts by David Pharr. We are using several of Joe Galloway's studies for those who have completed these. When talking to others about Bible Call why not ask them if they are interested in a personal study or talking a Bible course via mail.

Would it not be great if we could mail Wood County twice a year with the Bible Call? Can you commit more to this good work? If so Let the Elders know.

We sent 2000 leaflets to a congregation in Texas that is using this in a door knocking campaign this month.

The Steelton congregation in New Martinsville is preparing to mail that area twice a year.
