

Elders Must Know...

There are some things that an elder must know about himself as well as knowing what the Bible teaches on so he can be an effective elder. The Bible tells us the follow things that an elder must know:

An Elder must know himself. 1 Timothy 3, Titus 1 and 1 Peter 5:1-5 all teach that an elder must know himself. He must know how he relates with his wife, children, and the people in his community as well as to the Christians in the congregation. An elder must show he is able to manage his life well by being mature in the faith (Heb. 5:12-14). A man who is to be considered qualified for the position of elder needs to have spent time with his wife and family and continues to do so. Elders are men who lead their family in Christ and have managed them well; this is the main training ground for a man to be an elder. If a man cannot lead his family to Christ or manage them well how can he expect to lead the lost to the Lord or manage the church?

An Elder must know the congregation in such a way that they move the congregation forward and closer to God. As has already been stated the family is the training ground for one to be an elder. By learning to build good relationships in his home he will be able to build relationships with the people in the congregation and this will help him to better lead the congregation. When relationships are being built within the congregation the elders can know the "pulse" of the congregation so they can better meet the congregation's needs. This will help the elders to know how to move the congregation forward spiritually and help them to set goals to help the congregation to mature in Christ. The elders need to help the congregation to stay focused on the goal of Heaven and help others get there as well (Phil. 3:12). This is the idea of being a shepherd knowing the congregation and helping them get to heaven (1 Peter 5:1-4; and Acts 20:17-30).

An Elder must know how to be a servant. Jesus said those who want to lead must be a servant (Mt. 20:25-28; Jn. 13:14-15). A servant is a person who has the go first attitude, as Jesus modeled in His life. By this a leader needs to do the jobs that no one else is willing to do and teach others how to do them (Eph. 4:11-16). Elders need to also encourage others to be servants and to be faithful for the cause of Christ (1 Thes. 5:11). The Bible tells us that elders are helped with deacons who help with many aspects of serving the congregation. Elders also need to be setting the example for others to follow in word and deed (Col. 3:17). By being a servant, he shows the congregation what they must do to be servants of Christ as well.

Elders must know how to rest. Jesus also shows us that as a leader one needs to take time to rest and pray (Mark 1:35, 6:31 and 6:46). Elders must know themselves to the point that they know how much stress they can handle and realize the time to stop and rest. Elders who serve best take time to read their Bibles, focus on spiritual matters in prayer, and taking time to relax, doing things that they enjoy. Too many godly elders have failed the church and themselves because they did not know themselves well enough to stop and rest.

Doug's Discussion

The Mind of the Discouraged

I hear first impressions are really important. Thoughts and opinions can be formed in that first meeting that might never change. And that . . . can be discouraging. I don't think anyone ALWAYS puts their best foot forward. (I know I don't.) And then what? What if I believe, no matter what I do, you'll never change your negative opinion of me? I imagine that would have consequences regarding how hard I try to make things better.

I think we can learn from Job's lowest point. Just keep in mind a couple of things here. One: Job is extremely, understandably, discouraged. Two: he doesn't really understand the situation. This has led him to view God in an imperfect way. Having made that clear I'll tell you this is one of those situations where Job doesn't believe there is anything that can make the situation better. And consider the consequences found in Job 9:27-31. Job doesn't see the point of trying to fake an "everything's all right." That won't change anything. He also doesn't see the point of trying, saying: "Since I am already found guilty, why should I struggle in vain?" (Job 9:29). Finally, Job says that even if he does get clean again it won't matter because he believes that he would just get plunged back into the muck. Yeah, that's one discouraged guy.

Fortunately for Job he wasn't right. God did restore him again. But take this opportunity to see into the mind of a discouraged person! Without hope of positive change people stop struggling to make things better. All they have left is their complaint. Consider now the level of grace and forgiveness you show to other people. When they fall, when they stumble over their best foot, do you lift them up or try and make sure they stay down? When people are trying to wipe the dirt off do you shove them back into the mud? Does the way you look at someone tell them that you have found them guilty and you will always find them guilty? If so I suspect something unfortunate will happen. I think they will decide it's not worth struggling in vain.

Is that the Christian message? "Don't bother, you'll always be guilty in my eyes?" Or is the message more like "come and wash away the mud. I will remember your guilt no more. Be restored again!"? One message leads to hope and a renewed effort. One leads to giving up. Be sure you share the right one.
