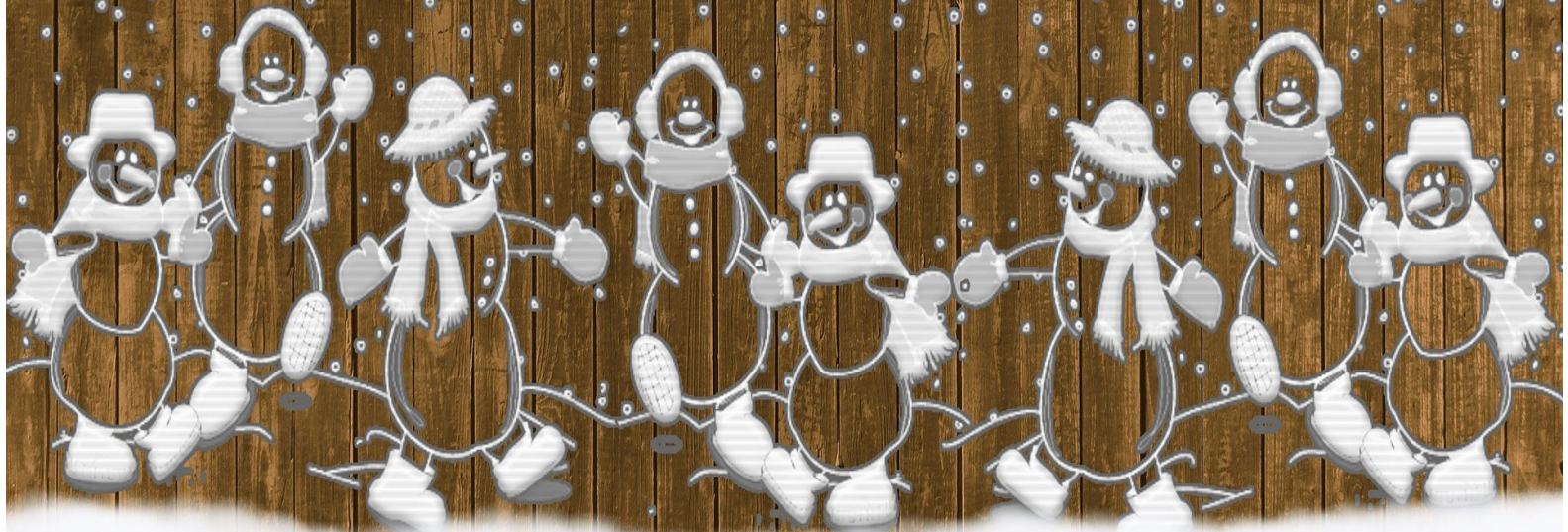

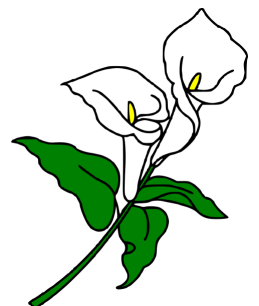

Let's Work Together

Several years ago, there was a football team that became famous. It had a backfield that rang up so many touchdowns that the backfield players became somewhat conceited. One day the coach decided they needed to be taught a lesson, so he pulled out the first team and sent in a string of substitutes. Very quickly the opposing team crashed through the substitute line and stopped the backfield cold. They were not the unbeatables they thought they were. After a few plays they frantically signaled the coach for help, and the first-string line went back in again. The backfield players learned that without the support of a strong line they could not score touchdowns. It takes all eleven men to win a football game.

The same is true of the Church. Although not called a team in scripture, the Church is called "the Body" and the same principle applies. 1 Cor. 12:12-27 teaches that there must be cooperation of every member if we are to accomplish the goals of our Lord here on earth. The Bible continues to teach us that each member must work together with God (2 Cor. 6:1). This means we are to not only pull together but must pull in the right direction.

Thomas Carlyle said, "Ten men banded together in love and unity can do what ten thousand separately would fail to do." This quote points out that there is strength in unity and working together. Jesus said in Matthew 12:25 "...Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation, and every city or house divided against itself shall not stand." These two quotes are very applicable to the Church today. The Church is faced with many trials from Satan. One is individualism, "doing what I want to do regardless of what anyone else tells me to do." This is a dangerous attitude and doesn't get us very far when trying to do the Lord's work, it's like the backfield of the football team, thinking they do not need the front line, to win football games. It will not work.

More can be done as a team effort or as a "body" than can be accomplished solo. Everything we do as the Church takes teamwork and trust. Every person in the congregation is valuable and needed. The Church is a team, and together we can build for the Lord. So, church let's work together!

Doug's Discussion

Tough to Hear, Tough to Say

Sometimes the message of God is not what people want to hear. When that's the case God's messengers have the unenviable task of bringing bad news. When God called Jeremiah his first response was "I don't know how to speak!" Maybe he had a good guess about what was coming. A heap of bad news, that's what. Jeremiah's message was a "boiling pot" from the north would be poured out and bring disaster on the land (Jeremiah 1:13-14). How popular do you think that message made Jeremiah? Or how about later when his message was to surrender to the Babylonians (see Jer. 38:17)? If Jeremiah's message was "God will bring you victory against this boiling pot – against this massive Babylonian army!" then he would have been the coolest guy in town. But instead it was "give up if you don't want to die." There was a reason Jeremiah got thrown into a mud pit.

Throughout history wicked people have received bad news from God. Important news. The idea is that if a wicked person gets bad news they may repent. They may decide they are not interested in the consequences so they change their lives to avoid them. That's what Nineveh did when Jonah brought them bad news. But remember that Jonah didn't much want to do it either. Let's face it, bringing bad news is no fun! I would much rather be the doctor who says "It's a boy!" than the one who says "I'm sorry, your wife has cancer." And I would much rather preach about God's blessings than to preach about his judgment. But sometimes, for some people, the latter message is much more important.

May we all have the willingness to speak unpopular messages when they are needed. If one of our children is being tempted by a homosexual lifestyle, may we speak clearly about what God says the consequences of that choice is. No, not a popular message. May we speak it anyway. It's not popular to stand alongside the road with signs protesting abortion. We certainly wouldn't win many friends by saying something like "if you really do want God to bless America there are some things we need to repent of." No, these are the kinds of messages that many don't want to hear. But if they need to hear it, for the benefit of their future hope, would you be willing to say it? Let me encourage you with the promise that was given to Jeremiah: "You must go to everyone I send you to and say whatever I command you. Do not be afraid of the, for I am with you and will rescue you" (Jeremiah 1:7-8). Bad news is tough to say. But if it's from God speak on. God is with you.

DO NOT FEAR. Jeremiah 1:7-8

- * Pray for the ministers, elders, and deacons.
- * Pray for the lost and for the opportunity to teach.
