

ELDERS, DEACONS, & PREACHERS MEETING – That was planned for January 17 has been canceled.



Start Now, Finish Well

Let me share something I've learned about large projects. This is a lesson I have learned painfully, as I am a natural procrastinator. When the task is big enough you cannot wait until the last minute to get it done. You do that and you end up showing up to class with a half-finished paper that gets about half the points (which is bad). You end up with a project that is still an embarrassing mess when the in-laws show up to visit. Some things MUST be started on time or near on time if they are going to get done by the deadline.

This church has presented the challenge of reading through the entire Bible in a year. I have always felt this is a worthy challenge – to make it through the entirety of Scripture before January 1st. I appreciate Mark for deciding to promote this effort. We should keep the Word before us, just like Joshua was told to do: "Do not let this Book of the Law depart from your mouth; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful" (Joshua 1:8). We cannot fully obey a Word we don't know and we won't know what we don't read and study. So yes, I too encourage every family and every individual to take up this challenge. I also know, if you haven't already, that this is going to be a real struggle unless you start ASAP.

Many people's commitment to read through Scripture gets tanked in the first few weeks of January. At my reading speed it takes about 15 minutes a day to read the whole Bible in a year. Is that a lot? Well, no. That's not a lot . . . if it is broken up into daily chunks. But what if I miss a day? Then the next day I need to read 30 minutes to catch back up. Which still, even with a full-time job and kids, isn't that difficult. But if I get into the habit of missing days and a whole week goes by then the task starts to get a bit more challenging. What I'm saying to you is this: reading Scripture through in a year is not something most people can accomplish by procrastinating for a couple of months. If you want

this to happen in your life start now. Start in January. Make Scripture something you read daily. That's the best chance you have to celebrate a wonderful accomplishment in December. I pray that's a celebration you experience this year and for many years to come.



A message from the elders to the church of Christ which meets at Camden Avenue:

The COVID-19 pandemic continues to greatly affect the members of Camden Avenue. More and more of the congregation is having to endure illness in their homes as the virus spreads more rapidly. Many of our Christian family have been hospitalized because of the impact of COVID-19 upon them.

We continue to pray for relief and God has granted us the development of vaccines to combat the virus. However, it will take time for health officials to distribute and administer the vaccines. The growing dangers to the membership at Camden Avenue remain for now.

With much prayer and deliberation, the elders have decided to make short term changes to our worship service and Bible study schedules. We believe these adjustments to be the most expedient actions to take. Effective Sunday morning, January 10, the Camden Avenue congregation will meet for public worship service once each week. All other services will be online only, streaming on Facebook Live.

These changes will continue for at least two weeks. On or about January 21, the eldership will reevaluate the impact COVID-19 is having on the Camden Avenue membership. A decision will be made then about any adjustments to this temporary schedule change.
