Why did God make the Dandelions?

It is getting to be that time of year when many of us will start mowing our lawns. One of the challenges of keeping a lawn nice and trim is dealing with dandelions. No matter how many times one cuts their lawn they usually come back the next day. They are difficult to pull, you almost never get the whole thing, because their roots grow deep into the ground. Let us not also forget the seeds, which seem to be in the thousands, and spread as the slightest blow of the wind.

Yet despite the disdain by those who take care of lawns, children find them beautiful. Who has not received a bouquet of dandelions from the dirty little hands of a child? No one ever fuses at children for picking them, but you might get fused at by the child if you do not put them in a vase to be displayed on the kitchen table.

So Why did God make these annoying little flowers? Were they made by God just for the enjoyment of children? Or to teach patience to those who mow lawns? Well according to an article by and Erik Lutz, posted March 28, 2018, on https://answersingenesis.org/biology/plants/why-did-god-make-weeds).

Dandelions are designed by God to be eaten and they are good for you. The greens have high levels of vitamin A and vitamin C, loads of vitamin K, and a host of other important nutrients. Dandelion roots and leaves have a long history of medicinal use for treating digestive issues, reviving the liver and gallbladder, and more.

Many historians believe the dandelion first came to North America as an herb and vegetable,

likely on the *Mayflower*. Even today, dandelions are cultivated in countries throughout the world. The whole plant is edible from the root to leaves, stem, and flower. *Of course, always exercise caution when identifying wild plants, and consult a professional before using any herb medicinally.*

So, dandelions are not just useless weeds or pretty flowers for the children to pick. They actually have a God-given design and purpose. Thinking about the dandelion reminds me that if God has a design and purpose for an annoying little flower like the dandelion, how much greater value does God have for us who are made in His image (Gen. 1:26-27). Remember we are "fearfully and wonderfully made...." (Ps. 139:14).

1 cup of dandelion greens = 535% of your daily recommended vitamin K and 112% of vitamin A.

Every part of the dandelion is edible.

Doug's Discussion

Plundered By Beauty

When the Israelites left their slavery in Egypt they asked their neighbors for articles of silver and gold. In this way they plundered the Egyptians. But this wasn't the first time Abraham and his descendants relieved Egypt of some of their possessions. The first time happened shortly after Abram left his home country and made a brief stop in Pharoah's land. Apparently Abram's wife, now in her sixties, looked really good for her age. Rumors of her beauty swept throughout the land and Pharoah decides that any sixty plus year old who can pull that off should be hanging out with him. So he takes her – but she wasn't his to take. Then "the Lord inflicted serious diseases on Pharoah and his household because of Abram's wife Sarai" (Genesis 12:17). Abram and his wife get sent away – but not before they had already acquired enough of Egypt's livestock to be called "very wealthy" in the next chapter. They got plundered . . . by beauty.

Not every threat to your livelihood carries a weapon. A handsome man or a pretty face can do just as much damage as an armed intruder – and in many cases more. Here's a good question to ask in order to avoid the pain: "Is this person mine to have and to hold?" Proverbs contains an interesting warning when it comes to trying to take someone who is already married. He or she is not yours! Don't make Pharoah's mistake. Keep far from their door, "lest you lose your honor to others and your dignity to one who is cruel, lest strangers feast on your wealth and your toil enrich the house of another" (Proverbs 5:9-10). Instead of your efforts building up your own home taking someone who doesn't belong to you leads to your efforts being used to build the house of another. Child support and alimony payments alone can help us imagine how this can be true.

Think hard and long about your relationships. Encourage others to do the same. Take the time to find out how available someone really is. I don't think it would have taken too much of an investigation for Pharoah to figure out Sarai's real relationship status. But no, instead he just took what he wanted without concern for the consequences. But, just as Pharoah soon found out, the price for a relationship God will not bless is simply too high. You may not pay in livestock but I suspect you'll miss the stolen wealth and years of your life. Is this someone you should be dating? Are they Biblically free to marry? Do they share your beliefs or will they hinder your walk with God? Find out my friends. Find out lest you join the many unfortunate souls who have been plundered by beauty.
