Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery

The King and His Bible

Many years before the elders of Israel came to the prophet Samuel and requested a king for Israel so they could be like the other nations (I Sam. 8:4-5), God spoke prophetically through Moses addressing this situation (Deut. 17:14-20). Much of what God said concerning Israel's king involved the king and his relationship to the Scriptures (Deut. 17:18-20).

The king was to have his own personal copy of the Bible. Moses wrote, "Also it shall be, when he sits on the throne of his kingdom, that he shall write FOR HIMSELF A COPY of this law in a book..." (Deut. 17:18, emp. added). Everyone ought to have his own personal copy of the Bible. We feel free to use what belongs to us personally. When it comes to my own personal copy of the Bible, I underline verses, circle words, make notes in the margins, and highlight passages. I would be hesitant to do this with someone else's Bible.

The king was to have his own personal copy of the Bible present with him. Moses, referring to the Bible, said, "And IT SHALL, BE WITH HIM..." (Deut. 17:19, emp. added). We need to have our Bible with us. Carry it to worship. Carry it in your purse or coat pocket. Put it under your pillow or beside our bed. If you cannot sleep, then you can turn on the light and read your Bible. Have it with you while you wait at the doctor's or dentist's office. Keep a Bible in your vehicle. You may get stuck in a traffic jam. Have your Bible with you as you wait at the airport. It likely is the case that most of us have several minutes daily when we could read our Bible if we only had the Book present with us.

The king was to daily pursue the message of the Bible. "...He shall READ IT"

Continue reading through your Bible in 2021.

Doug's Discussion

Who is to Blame?

Is your sin someone else's fault? I mean, yes, you did evil, but is it really because you had lousy parents? Did you lust because SHE wore too short a dress? Did you lie, cheat, and/ or steal because the devil made you do it? I'm just curious where you think the blame lies. I'm fairly certain that, on the list ranking who is most to blame, some have themselves WAY down the list. I won't deny that outside influences can make the right choice more difficult. I'm sure that's true. But, ultimately, the blame for our wrongdoing must belong to us. After all: "No temptation has overtaken you except what is common to mankind. And God is faithful; he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear" (1 Corinthians 10:13). Since God is faithful there is always a way out. Since there is a way out falling to temptation is our fault.

Speaking of being common to mankind . . . the instinct to first blame others for our personal failure goes wayyyy back. Do you remember what Adam said when he was busted for eating forbidden fruit? "The woman you put here with me – she gave me some fruit from the tree, and I ate it" (Genesis 3:12). Adam did wrong. He could have said, "yes Lord, I ate the fruit. I'm guilty and I'm sorry." Instead he blamed Eve and it sounds like he's even blaming God. "God, if you didn't give me this woman none of this would have happened!" We have a hard time owning up to what we have done. We always have. Our fear of rejection makes us think that lying to ourselves and others is the way to go. That fear is unfounded. In the long run I've always respected flawed but honest people over those who insist on hiding their responsibility to pursue a false image of perfection.

I think Daniel could be a great example to us. This man is listed as one of the most right-eous men in the Bible. Daniel's opponents looked hard for an accusation and couldn't find a single one. And yet, when this righteous man prayed to God, he did not shy away from acknowledging that he was guilty too. "we have sinned and done wrong. We have been wicked and have rebelled; we have turned away from your commands and laws. We have not listened to your servants the prophets . . ." (Daniel 9:5-6). Daniel could have said, "God, these countrymen you gave me are all rotten and if I get dragged down with them it's their fault!" Instead Daniel simply says "we have sinned." Daniel was highly esteemed. I wonder why.

- Finding my purpose in my service to God.

Bíble Call Report-March 2021

Let us keep up the good work of calling and telling others about the Bible Call program. We had 301 calls in February. This represents more than 40 + hours of teaching the Bible via this means.

The high days were the 22nd with 31 calls and the 20th with 29 calls.

The most requested calls again were for 321 The Holy Spirit (14), 110 Overcoming Worry (11), also 906 Homosexuality (11), 319 For What Should a Sinner Pray (9,) 306 Repentance (8), 610 Which Is the Right Church (8), 650 Life After Death (6), 304 Are We Saved by Faith Only (7), 959 Snake Handling (6), and 122 How to Help Yourself Become Better (7). 27 times people listened to the same lesson again.

The congregation at Steelton in New Martinsville did a mailing again. We have had calls from other congregations about getting leaflets to hand out and how they can use Bible Call in their community. The last request was from Seth, WV where Mike Tichner is preaching. He has also been talking with Clayton about other means of outreach. It is good to see more congregations seeking to know how they can reach out to those who are lost.

How many are planning to go to the special program in Nashville to learn more about this? Many will be there to share what they are doing. Connect Conference June 2 - 5 2021 Crieve Hall church of Christ Nashville, TN. Pray for this work and every effort to take the gospel to every creature. Let us work to fulfill the Lord's final exhortation Matt 28:19-20 "Go Ye therefore and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you; and lo I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen "

In these times that are so challenging we have an opportunity to reach into homes with the word. Let us call daily and get the word out to others personally and to sister congregations.
