

Value of Church Camp

When I first heard about church camp, it was from the children in Bible class talking about it after they had returned from a fun week of camp. As soon as Bible class let out, I would then beg my parents to go to camp; I begged my parents for a couple of years before they allowed my sister and I to attended West Virginia Christian Youth Camp (WVCYC).

My first year to go to camp was 1987, it was also my first time to attend a weeklong, overnight camp. The camp was then located in Richie County, West Virginia at the 4-H camp. It was scary at first being away from home and not knowing many of the people other than a couple kids from Bible class. This did not last long, by supper time the fear had worn off and I was making friends.

Camp was a wonderful place, from the people, the fun activities, and the Bible lessons; to me it was heaven on earth. The teachers at church camp helped me to study the Bible for myself and were never afraid to answer my questions with Bible answers. Each year of camp the Bible lessons and teachers helped stretch my mind and helped me to grow in Christ.

It has been over 34 years since I first attended WVCYC as a camper. In that time, I have worked with at least six different church camps, and I have served in almost every role at camp there is, such as a janitor, fire builder, counselor, dish washer, Bible Class teacher, speaker, assistant director, and director.

Since coming to Camden Ave. I am once again working with WVCYC and this year I will be filling the role of assistant director for All Age Week.

Church camp is an effective tool in the spiritual development of young people. Very few places in our day and time are influenced with the Christ centered teachings and spiritual influences as church camp. As I look at my life, I am a better and stronger Christian because of the Biblical teaching and influence that took place at church camp. Doug's Discussion

God Can Toss the Devil Into a Van

Much to my 8-year-old's delight we bought a trampoline the other day. Barely. When I went to move the box to my cart I found out

that trampolines are heavy. I could barely slide it. So of course, I had to request help to put in the car . . . and I half expected four store associates to show up to do the cart to car lift. Nope – it was just one guy. I asked him – "ready to move a three-hundred-pound trampoline?" (That's what it felt like to me anyway). He said: "no problem, I've done it before." Then the guy proceeds to grip the box with one hand and he tosses it into the van. Okay then . . .

Preachers don't do a lot of physical fighting but if for some reason I had to fight a guy like that how would I go about it? Do you think it would be a good idea to march up to him and challenge him to a boxing match? Hmm . . . I'm picturing him laughing and then picking me up with one hand and tossing me into my van. No, the honorable head-on approach would never work. All the advantages are on his side. The only chance I would have would be to be sneaky. I would have to ambush him in some way in a moment he least expects it. Okay, I would never do that, that's true. But if I did I would be acting like someone I really don't want to imitate.

Satan cannot beat God's people in a fair fight. All the advantages are on one side. As the Word reminds us, "the One who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world" (1 John 4:4). It's not that we are great, but God is – and He is our help. Unfortunately, for some reason, the devil still wants to fight. So how does it go about it? I think he's figured out that head on challenges don't work – so instead he "prowls around" (1 Peter 5:8). Perhaps you've seen a stalking lion, sneaking up on its prey. The lion typically tries to catch the victim unaware. So then, may I suggest keeping your eyes open and remaining vigilant? If you belong to God the devil can't beat you head on. But that won't stop him from trying to sneak into your life little by little. He'll encourage seemingly small compromises. He'll encourage questioning God's Word. He'll encourage discord and division to separate you from the good influences in your life. Christian friends, the devil can't win unless you let him. So don't.

And I fear that kind of despair is in our future if our nation turns away from God. We need purpose, but there is no purpose without our Lord. This is something the atheist community admits . Richard Dawkins said in the "universe we observe" there is "no purpose." The writer of the *Young Atheist's Handbook* says "Yes, of course I know that life is ultimately without meaning or purpose, but the trick is not to wake up every morn-ing and feel that way."

That is the trick - to avoid despair while living a life that ultimately doesn't matter. While moving rocks from one pile to another, or you can turn to God and find all the meaning and purpose your heart desires.

Pantry Request


Due to the Postal Food Drive being cancelled, each Care Group is being asked to bring in the following items and place them on the table in the pantry.
