

Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery

We Cannot Just do Nothing

The historian Thomas Carlyle talks about Louis XV the king of France in the 1700s. He records that France was in terror, and chaos because of tyrants. When Louis XV became king, he was young and inspired the people of France so much that they affectionately called him "Louis the Well-Beloved." This name was given to him, not because of anything he had done but what they had hoped he would do for France. The nation was looking for peace and believed their new young king could bring the stability they desired. Thirty years later, Louis XV lay sick, and France hated him. Why? Because for over thirty years he had done nothing.

In the book of Revelation, we learn about a church that did nothing. The church at Laodicea was lukewarm. Jesus declares in, Rev 3:15-16, "I know your works: you are neither cold nor hot. Would that you were either cold or hot! So, because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth."

Doing nothing is unhealthy for a king or for the church. Paul teaches in 2 Thess. 3:10, "If anyone is not willing to work, let him not eat." James 4:17, tells us, "So whoever knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, for him it is sin." James reminds us, doing nothing is a sin.

Read the book of Acts and notice that much of the Lord's work was done by Christians who volunteered their time and effort. One would also notice that very few were paid for their labors. Such is the case today; for the church to function as it should it needs members to work, labor, and to volunteer. Yes, some people will be paid so they can devote much more of their time to spreading the Gospel and building up the Kingdom, but the church still needs Christians to be great volunteers.

The Bible calls us to work and labor in the Kingdom. We each must put forth an effort to spread the gospel, to do works of service, and even to be in worship on the Lord's Day as well as throughout the week for other times of Bible study (Heb. 10:25).

Paul warns his readers in Rom. 12:6-8 to be diligent in their work for the Lord. Col. 3:23, states, "Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men."

Question: Are we diligent in the work of the Lord? The Lord needs every member to be involved with the work of the church, we cannot just do nothing in the Kingdom of Christ.

Church, there is much work to do even Jesus acknowledges this in Mat. 9:37-38, "Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

Will you pray for laborers to work in the Kingdom of Christ, better yet will you be a laborer and worker in the Kingdom? Think about it! Mark T. Tonkery

Doug's Discussion

Noah's Not a Myth

When European settlers came to Hawaii they heard an interesting story from the indigenous people. A legend had been passed down about the earth becoming a wicked place. Only one good man was left, and his name was Nu-u. This man made a great canoe with a house on it and filled it with animals. In this story the waters came up over all the earth and killed all the people; only Nu-u and his family were saved.

Pretty interesting, right? I wonder if any Christian settler opened their Bible to show the natives the story written by the One who was actually there. "The Lord saw how great man's wickedness on the earth had become . . . But Noah found favor in the eyes of the Lord" (Genesis 6:5,8). "I am going to bring floodwaters on the earth to destroy all life under the heavens, every creature that has the breath of life in it. Everything on earth will perish. But I will establish my covenant with you, and you will enter the ark – you and your sons and your wife and your son's wives with you. You are to bring into the ark two of all living creatures . . . " (Genesis 6:17-19).

Today it isn't hard to find someone who would say the flood and the ark are myths. But if that's true, where did the Hawaiian's story come from? How about the similar legends found in Persia, Syria, Egypt, Italy, Russia, China, India, Peru, and a whole bunch of other places? Kind of interesting that all these ancient cultures came up with the same myth together. Clearly these stories have a basis in ancient historical truth . . . a truth you can find every time you open up your Bible.

When you have devotional time, and you open up scripture, never doubt that what you read is true. The flood happened in the way God describes. Creation happened in the way Genesis explains it. Jesus came and died just like the Bible says He did. Will there be plenty of doubters? Sure. But I'm not one of them. If your heart is open enough to accept the evidence you won't be either.
