

Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery

Seventh Day Adventist Book

Many of you have asked me about a book that you received in the mail recently, entitled "The Great Controversy," subtitle: "Will Two Former Rivals Unite?" On the cover, is the picture of the U.S. capital reflected in the water and the American flag over the top. The book does not tell who sent it but with a little research I found that the book is put out by the Seventh Day Adventist religious group.

The book itself was written in the late 19th century by Ellen G. White, one of the founders of the Seventh Day Adventist denomination. White is said to be an Adventist "prophet", and the book explains the denomination's interpretation of Christianity.

According to the **Charlotte Area News** (https://www.wfae.org/local-news/2014-01-31/that-book-you-got-in-the-mail) Donors from across the U.S. contribute to the mass mailings of the copies of the book to various cities. This book is one of the tools the Seventh Day Adventists are using to recruit new members.

The Seventh Day denomination is a religious group that believes in meeting on the seventh day or the Sabbath day or our Saturday instead of on the first day of the week (Acts 20:7). They also have other beliefs that are not found in the New Testament such as when a person dies, they believe their spirit is in an unconscious state and the wicked will be annihilated, yet the Bible tells us that we all will face judgment (Heb. 9:27). They also believe that Ellen G. White's writings are inspired like the Bible. Jude 3 tells us that faith was once delivered for all and in 2 Peter 1:3, Peter wrote that in the first century "all things pertaining to life and godliness," was already given. This was about 1,800 years before Ellen G. White was born. Ellen G. White also made false prophecies during her lifetime, and Deut. 18:22 teaches if a prophet says something and it does not come true, they are a false prophet.

1 John 4:1, reminds us, "Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, for many false prophets have gone out into the world."

For more information on the Seventh Day Adventist, you may go to www.bible.ca and type Seventh Day Adventist to learn more about their beliefs. Also starting Sept. 1 in the auditorium adult class, I will begin a series of lessons on different religious groups and compare them to the Bible. Hope you can be with us on Wednesday evenings as well as all of our times of meeting.

Doug's Discussion

A New Life

I think that change is a funny word. You can get all kinds of interesting reactions from people by saying the word "change." I think it's better than "boo!" Try it sometime... walk up behind someone and say "I'd like to change . . ." and see what happens. As a general rule people hate change! We don't think we need it. And that's going to cause us problems with a God who wants to change a lot. Listen: "And we, who with unveiled faces all reflect the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his likeness with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit" (2 Corinthians 3:18). The Bible says we are being transformed into the likeness of God. God is, little-by-little, changing us so that we look like His Son. Is something in your life not Christ-like? Then God wants you to change.

God wants to change the way we speak, our attitude toward sin, the way we dress, the things we do, the way we treat our spouse and our kids and our friends, our church attendance, and everything else. In fact, being a genuine Christian involves so much change that people might not recognize us anymore. There should be an obvious contrast between before Jesus and after Jesus. The Bible calls it an old life and a new life. "We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life" (Romans 6:4). A whole new life. The old life is dead and gone. THAT is what God is accomplishing in you through Christ.

If your new life looks like your old life then maybe your new life isn't what God has in mind. Are you willing to change? I think that if we give our life up to God then God will do

something wonderful. "For just as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, even so the Son gives life to whom he is pleased to give it" (John 5:21). You can have your life. OR you can give up your life and have the life God gives. Which do you think is better? I suggest letting God change whatever He wants.
