

Ways you can invite someone to our Gospel Meeting

On Oct. 3-6, Camden Ave. will be having a Gospel Meeting. We must remember that the main goal of having a Gospel Meeting is to invite our friends, neighbors, co-workers, classmates, and family members to hear the word of God. In my sermon last week, I gave some practical ways we can invite people to study the Bible with us, which can also be used to invite people to our Gospel Meeting. So here are some of those ideas repeated and other creative ideas we can do to invite people:

- Give a neighbor who is moving into your neighborhood free lightbulbs or a flashlight (with batteries). Say something like "You'll probably have a lightbulb go out some time, so here's one," or if it is a flashlight say, "If the electricity goes out this might come in handy." Then say. "By the way, did you know that Jesus is the light of the world (John 8:12)? You can learn more about Him at our Gospel Meeting we are having, why don't you and your family come with us."
- Bake some bread and give it to someone, and say something like, "by the way did you know Jesus is the Bread of life (John 6:35)? You can learn more about Him at our Gospel Meeting we are having, why don't you and your family come with us."
- Give out water to the people in your neighborhood or local park and as you give the water to them say something like, "did you know that Jesus can give us spiritual drink (John 7:37-38)? "You can learn more about Him at our Gospel Meeting we are having, why don't you and your family come with us."
- Go to the laundromat or carwash and feed quarters into the machine, and say something like, "Have you been washed by the blood of Christ (1 Cor. 6:11)? You can learn more about Him at our Gospel Meeting we are having, why don't you and your family come with us."
- Give someone a nice flower, and say something like, "Did you know Jesus is like a plant (vine) (John 15:1-7)? You can learn more about Him at our Gospel Meeting we are having, why don't you and your family come with us."
- Pass out microwave popcorn or a can of soda pop with a note attached that says, "Pop into our Gospel Meeting." Include your name and information about our Gospel Meeting.

Can you think of other creative ways of inviting people to our Gospel Meeting? All these ideas are to help build friendships and to show we are servants of Christ trying to share our faith in today's modern world. It is amazing to see how responsive people become as the result of a simple gift or act of servanthood.

Wisdom is Obeying God

Jonah heard the call of the Lord. "Go to the great city of Nineveh and preach against it, because its wickedness has come up before me" (Jonah 1:2). Jonah, however, made an executive decision to ignore those clear instructions. By doing so he became one of the premier Biblical examples of what not to do. One storm and one large fish later we see how unwise it is to ignore the command of God, thinking we can outrun or outsmart Him. We can't. It's foolish to try.

Wisdom comes to a different conclusion regarding following the Word of the Lord. "Now all has been heard; here is the conclusion of the matter: Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man" (Ecclesiastes 12:13). We all have some decisions to make when we hear from God, which we do every time we open up His Word. Are God's commands meant to be a burden, or are they given out of love? I think God's character answers that one. Also, are we wiser than God – thinking that we can come up with a better way to go? That one is also not difficult if we just take a moment to think about it. And do we believe, by faith, that there is reward for those servants who obey the Lord's call? The Bible clearly says "yes." Do you believe it?

I encourage you to be wise. Have the vision to see where the road you're on leads. If the destination is a smelly fish stomach you are certainly on the wrong road. Wisdom

knows better. Wisdom knows "his commands are not burdensome, for everyone born of God overcomes the world" (1 John 5:3-4). Can't you see that obeying God now is better than obeying Him later (or not at all)? Can't you see that setting aside your objections and your own agendas is the best thing for you? Trust and obey friends. There is no other wise way.

Picture a wife who spends two hours making a delicious meal for her husband because she wants to give him something special. The husband eats it without comment and then heads straight to the T.V. OR picture God answering a prayer, as he did in the Bible when someone asked him for a longer life. But, then 2 Chronicles 32:25 says that after this man's answered prayer his "heart was proud and he did not respond to the kindness shown him."

Why do we do that? Why do we ignore blessings? Maybe because we think we are owed these blessings. My wife SHOULD make me a two hour dinner every night, my parents SHOULD give me expensive gifts for my birthday. God SHOULD keep me healthy and safe. I deserve it and that's their job.
