



Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery

Do you know whom you believe in?

Joe Bailey in his book "A View From a Hearse" tells of the day his boy died of cancer. He had returned to the clinic to thank them for their kindness and care of his son. As he spoke to the receptionist, she motioned toward a woman whose son was playing quietly with toys in the waiting area. "He has the same cancer your son had," she said. "Why don't you go over and see if you can talk with her." Bailey went reluctantly over to sit next to her and they whispered just out of hearing of the boy. "It must be hard bringing him in for the treatments," he said, more a statement than a question. "Hard," she turned with anguish in her eyes. "I die every time I have to bring him in. What makes it worse is that I know it's not going to stop the cancer and that he's going to die." Uncomfortable, Bailey ventured: "Still it is some comfort to know that when that happens there is no more pain and suffering and that they go to a better place." "No," with hardness in her voice. "When he dies, I'm just going to bury him in

the cemetery, and I'll never see him again. "Bailey wanted to leave. It was uncomfortable to be reminded of his loss and even more uncomfortable to speak with this woman who obviously had no hope in any way. Then he spoke quietly, "I buried my boy just yesterday, and I've only come today to thank the doctors and nurses for their kindness. I know what you're feeling but I also know that there is a better life for my son now." "How could you believe such a thing," she challenged. And then Joe Bailey told her about Jesus.



The hymn writer tells us "I know not why God's wondrous grace to me he has made known. Nor why, unworthy, Christ in love, redeemed me for His own.... But I know whom I have believed...." (By Daniel Webster Whittle).

Do you know who you believe in? The Bible tells us that "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life." Then in Mark 16:16 we see that belief results in one being baptized into Christ, and once one is baptized, they continue believing in Jesus Christ (Heb. 11:6). Without the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ, there is no Heaven for the sinner.

As we go through this week remember what Christ has done and is doing to give eternal life to those who believe and obey the Gospel. Ask yourself, "If the Lord were to come right now. Would I know for sure, nothing doubting that I would go to Heaven to be with Christ?

The Beginning of the Gospel

Doug's Discussion

Lasting Greatness

David's son Absalom wanted to be great. He was willing to do whatever was necessary to achieve this greatness – including betray his father. He did just that, and ended up doing quite well for himself. For a few moments he became king of Israel. How much greater of a title could you have? What's more, he even set up a monument to himself that endured for years. "During his lifetime Absalom had taken a pillar and erected it in the King's Valley as a monument to himself, for he thought, 'I have no son to carry on the memory of my name.' He named the pillar after himself, and it is called Absalom's Monument to this day" (2 Samuel 18:18). He's king. He has statues in his honor. Would you say that Absalom achieved the greatness he sought? Sure. But what did that all get him? In the end he was hanging by his long hair in the branches of an oak tree. How great are you really when your mule takes off leaving you hanging (literally) while surrounded by enemies determined to kill you? Absalom wanted to be greatest and ended being nothing.

The desire to be great certainly didn't end in that tree. There were times when Jesus' disciples had the same malady. They also wanted to be great, asking Jesus at one point: "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" (Matthew 18:1). In God's eyes greatness is something entirely different from the way people like Absalom view it. It's not putting yourself forward for honors and position. Greatness isn't squishing the person next to you so that you get more or you look better than them. Greatness, as you can see in the answer of Jesus, is the opposite. "And he said: 'I tell you the truth, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Therefore, whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 18:3-4). May God bless the many children who are just happy to be alive and who don't care about being better than everyone else! So many of them are too humble for that. We should join them.

There will be a great reversal in heaven my friends. The world is full of people who have achieved many things by putting themselves first. Jesus warns these about the danger of not getting to heaven at all. But there are even those in Christ who struggle with the temptation of self-promotion. Will they be first in heaven? I think that scripture teaches that those who are greatest in God's kingdom are those who put other people above themselves. "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves" (Philippians 2:3). It is a rare person indeed who lives this way. I encourage you to be the anti-Absalom! Put other people forward instead of yourself. Do that and your reward in heaven will be great indeed.

It happened in South Africa some animal poachers snuck into an animal reserve to try to illegally kill some rhinos. They were caught, you might say, and will not do it again. The authorities found the poachers equipment and remains, yes that is correct, their remains were scattered over the ground where they were poaching. It seems they were not the only hunters on the reserve. The lions were hunting too, and the poachers became their prey.

It is a reminder that our sins will find us out. Numbers 32:23, tells us, "..., you have sinned against the LORD, and be sure your sin will find you out." Before we are caught in our sins, may we apply 1 John 1:9 which states, "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."
