

The very words GOSPEL MEETING carry with them this idea. It is a series of meetings in which the Gospel message will be proclaimed. Why is this important? Because the Gospel is THE power to save (Romans 1:16). The people must receive the message to be saved (1 Corinthians 15:1-2). The lost person must obey the commands of the Gospel to be saved (2 Thessalonians 1:7-9). Therefore the Gospel - facts, promises, and the commands - must be proclaimed.



Doug's Discussion

No Unlocking This Lock

A couple of my friends are getting married this weekend. They are doing something at their wedding that I have never seen before. (Apparently it is a thing though, and if I my ignorant self frequented a legendary website called Pinterest I would know all about it). The idea is they bought a lock that, once shut, can never be opened. It's a keyless lock. Normally I'd say that's a terrible idea – but they are using it as a picture of their unity. They are going to shut this lock together after the wedding ceremony to signify they will do nothing to undo what has been done this day. Jesus' words come to mind: "what God has joined together, let man not separate" (Mark 10:9).



But what if someday they want to get out of the marriage? After all, there are ups and downs to any relationship. Perhaps on some down one of them wants to leave. Well... too bad. The door is locked and there's no key. Maybe someday (God forbid!) in a weak moment the groom thinks about leaving for another woman. He takes two steps and his arm yanks back. He's already bound, and for this binding there is no key. Maybe someday (God forbid!) the bride begins to daydream about how much she thinks her life was better without the responsibilities of husband and home. But then that lock comes to mind. The lock that cannot be opened, the commitment they made before God.

I don't know if you can tell but I like the image. I'm sure some will mock it, laughing about being "locked away" with someone you're "stuck" with. But I think it's beautiful. I think it's a picture of trust and faithfulness. It's like you're saying to your spouse: "I'm with you, and I don't want out. I'm putting a lock on this marriage and I'm throwing away the key. Well, actually there is no key. Even better!" Married friends, if leaving isn't an option for you then you won't leave. Since willfully leaving separates what God has joined together I'd say several locks on our doors and our hearts is a good idea. "So guard yourself in your spirit, and let none of you be faithless to the wife of your youth" (Malachi 2:15).

A Note from our speaker: David Price

Praying and asking for prayer for your struggles and stumbles are essential, but so is making real changes to how you live life (Luke 3:7-14).

There comes a time (and the time is now) to get serious about actually doing something that will bring different, better outcomes.

How?

- 1. Decide (very specifically, with Scriptures) what the godly, obedient you looks like; dwell on that Biblical picture of the righteous you every day.
- 2. Set one or two specific goals and create action plans to achieve them, then take action on them every single day.
- 3. Change your daily habits and routines.
- 4. Use Scriptures to affirm the possibility of change and God's power working within you to create it.
- 5. Get accountability help from one or two men and follow through with it.

It's not easy - but it is doable.

But not if you 're just waiting and hoping for something to happen to you.

You must take action by doing something different if you desire outcomes different than what you've been experiencing.

The choice is yours - but there's no other path to deliverance and change.
