## Let's Give Thanks

There is a story told of a good king in Spain known as Alfonso XIX who learned that the boys who served in his court were forgetting to pray before their meals. So, he decided to teach them a lesson. He gave a banquet and invited them to attend. Midway through the dinner a ragged beggar came in, sat down, and began eating ravenously. When he was finished, he went out without saying a word.

"That ungrateful wretch ought to be whipped," shouted the boys. "He ate the king's food and never showed gratitude." Quietly the king rose to his feet, and silence fell over the group. "Daily you have taken the rich blessings of life from the hand of your Heavenly Father," said the king. "You've enjoyed His sunshine, breathed His air, eaten His food He has provided, and you have not bothered to say 'thank you' for any of them. You are more ungrateful than that beggar."

How many of us are like those unthankful boys, we accept God's daily blessings as commonplace, rather than the special gifts they are.

The Bible teaches us that as Christians we should be known for our thankfulness. We are to be the type of people who give thanks for our daily food and needs as Jesus did (Mt. 15:36). We are to give thanks for our salvation. 1 Cor. 15:57, it states, "But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." We are to give thanks when good is done for us. In Lk. 17:16 only one leper returned to say thank you to Jesus when his leprosy was healed. Let's be like that, thankful for when



good is done to us. May we give thanks for Christ's church. Rm. 16:4, Paul said, "he gave thanks for all the churches..."

Eph. 5:20, teaches, "giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ,"

Over 550 times in the Bible thankfulness is mentioned or referred to, that is almost two Bible verses a day to remind us to be thankful. So, let's give thanks!

# Doug's Discussion

## Work in Every Season

I think it's worth knowing that there are "seasons" to evangelism, with some seasons being more exciting than others. I love it when it is late summer or early fall and the harvest is coming in. Isn't it wonderful when someone is coming forward every other week? Isn't it exciting to see several people give their lives to Jesus in baptism? Abso-



lutely! These moments can seem like singular points in time, moments that come out of nowhere. But they are not – they are just the tip of the iceberg. So many things, so much encouragement and effort went into that moment that goes unseen by most. For every summer there was a winter and spring where there was no fruit to be found.

Jesus walked the earth in the summertime. How exciting for his disciples! Jesus proclaims: "I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest. Even now the reaper draws his wages, even now he harvests the crop for eternal life" (John 4:35-36). Thousands were coming to hear the message. In Acts we see thousands upon thousands becoming Christians. Even with all the persecution that must have been an amazing thing to see. Of course, it didn't come out of nowhere. Many people who lived in the wintertime did some very hard work to prepare for these days. There were several prophets who lived in a time that God says this about: "To a nation that did not call on my name, I said, 'Here am I, here am I.' All day long I have held out my hands to an obstinate people, who walk in ways not good, pursuing their own imaginations" (Isaiah 65:1-2). That sounds like winter to me. But these prophets labored through, proclaiming the Word of God while seeing little to no results. They plowed the cold, hard ground.

No matter what season we are in it is good to serve the Lord. If fall passes into winter we should still work with all our hearts for God's glory. What if the farmer decided that plowing the ground and planting seed wasn't worth his time? What if he decided feeding the animals throughout the winter was too much effort? Yes, it's hard work. It's not as fun as reaping – but it is work that must be done. Jesus says about those who live in the winter: "Others have done the hard work, and you have reaped the benefits of their labor" (John 4:38). We may not see the fruit of our efforts – but others will as long as we carry on. Even if the land and the hearts are cold put on your coats and keep trying. Spring and summer will come again.

There are days in all our lives that feel like a battle. How are we going to win? What do we trust to get us out of trouble? Do you believe your rainy day fun can make the sun shine again? Do you trust Siri or Google or Alexa will have the answer to your problem? Do you hold to the belief that dad and mom can make every boo-boo better? Well, I'm sure your parents are very capable amateur medical practitioners, but I think ultimately our trust should be higher than our parents or the latest semi-smart phone.

Psalm 20:7 says, "Some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we trust in the name of the Lord our God." In the day of battle the only One who can rescue us every time is the Lord.

That doesn't mean trusting will always be easy. When you're in trouble you're in trouble until you're not in trouble, and being in trouble isn't fun. Before the rescue comes we may anxiously wonder where it is. But I encourage you to believe the Word and know by faith that the rescue is coming for those who love God. I can't guarantee that if your trust is in anything else.
