Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery

What does Thanksgiving Mean to You?

You ask any number of people what Thanksgiving means, and you will probably get that many different answers. For example, if you could have asked the first pilgrims who came to this country what thanksgiving meant to them, they might have said things like religious freedom, safety from the long journey across the sea, or expressed thankfulness that the Wampanoag Indians took pity on them

and helped them plant corn, build shelter, and taught them how to survive in the new world.

Fast forward to 1789 and ask George Washington what thankfulness means to him and you would get these words, "By the President of the United States of America. A proclamation: Whereas, it is the duty of all nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey His will, to be grateful for His benefits, and humbly to implore His protection and favor...

"Whereas, Both Houses of Congress have by their joint committee requested me `to recommend to the people of the United States a day of Public Thanksgiving and Prayer, to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many signal favors of Almighty God. . .'

"Now, Therefore I do recommend and assign Thursday, the 26th day of November next, to be devoted by the People of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being who is the beneficent Author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be. . ." So reads the very first Thanksgiving Proclamation. (Edited for space).

Fast forward to our day and time and ask people what thanksgiving means to them, and one might get answers such as, spending time with their friends and family, eating a large meal, or a day where one could watch football all day uninterrupted.

Now let's go to the Bible and see what it means when it teaches about "thanksgiving":

- 1 Thess. 5:18, "give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."
- Eph. 5:4, "Let there be no filthiness nor foolish talk nor crude joking, which are out of place, but instead let there be thanksgiving."
- Php. 4:6, "do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God."
- Col. 2:7, "rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving."
- Col. 4:2, "Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving."
- 1 Tim. 4:4, "For everything created by God is good, and nothing is to be rejected if it is received with thanksgiving,"

The Bible teaches that thanksgiving is one of the many attributes that each Christian should have in all circumstances. Although what we in America celebrate as a day of thanksgiving is a wonderful idea and a great reminder to be thankful, the Bible teaches us that thanksgiving is not seasonal but a way of life for the Christian.

Doug's Discussion

You Can Tell

Jesus teaches that you know someone by their fruit (Matthew 7:16). I find this to be incredibly useful. I am not wise enough to make fair and accurate judgments on all things. I simply don't have time to do the necessary research or to conduct the necessary interviews to know everything about everything. However, it is usually not difficult to know the KIND of thing that something is. There are many times when I can make the distinction between evil and good based on how something or someone acts. Given enough time you can see that good things bear good fruit and bad things bear bad fruit.

Once there was a great contest going on in the minds of men between two groups. Were the apostles, representing Christianity, right or were the Jews right? In the city of Iconium "The people of that city were divided; some sided with the Jews, others with the apostles" (Acts 14:4). And how could people decide, especially those who haven't spent a lifetime reading scripture? Both groups spoke persuasively. Both were very passionate about what they believed. However, despite all this, I don't think it was difficult to perceive who was on the side of God. How do I know? Based on what they did. In once place the Jews "were filled with jealously and talked abusively against what Paul was saying" (Acts 13:45). In another they plotted to mistreat Paul and stone him. Such was what Paul faced wherever he went, enduring all these troubles with grace. Who then was on the side of God? Those with hearts full of hate and murder, or the ones proclaiming the gospel? Even if I knew nothing about the gospel I don't think that would be hard to tell.

I would like to say that I stand against abortion. I believe, after studying the Bible, that the Bible stands against abortion. I have made a careful study of this and have reviewed many arguments from both sides of the issue. I would like to think I have something of an informed position. However, even if I didn't go through all this effort I don't think it would be difficult to tell what was right. Take one shift on a public abortion protest and I think you would be able to figure it out. Expect hate filled words. I've even had things thrown at me, once at the pregnant woman next to me. Can you not tell who stands in the right, based on how people act? Good trees bear good fruit. Bad trees bear bad fruit. I encourage you all

to apply this principle as you consider what or who to support. If it doesn't bear good fruit it's not from God. Find what does.

The Bible teaches us that thanksgiving is something we are always to do. The apostle Paul was a thankful man. He was thankful to Jesus for putting him into the ministry (1 Tim. 1:12), for the faith of his fellow Christians (Col. 1:3-4), for those who risked themselves for his ministry (Rom. 16:4), for salvation (1 Cor. 15:57), and indeed for all things (Eph. 5:20).

What sort of "thanksgiving list" would we put together? Perhaps it would include our family, our home, the church, our health, and our job, in addition to the spiritual blessings Paul mentions. Whatever the case, the important thing is to remember to be thankful every day; because ultimately, God is the source of all blessings (James 1:17).
