

Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery

How do we use our words?

Every day we humans use words. We use words to talk to our families, we use words at our places of work and school. We even "text" words and use our words on social media. The important question is how are we using our words?

There once was a 44 year-old man who became ill in the middle of the night. His wife called the rescue squad to rush him to the hospital. When his wife was allowed to see him in the hospital room he was hooked up to tubes and machines, instead of being happy to see her, he berated her by saying, "If it wasn't for your big mouth I would not be in this shape." Those were his last words to her as he died shortly afterward. I cannot imagine how this wife felt upon hearing those last words from her husband, but my guess is this was not the first time she was berated by her husband.

How do we talk to our spouses, children, parents, or close friends? "Researchers have determined that because of the way the mind and memory work, we need to hear eleven positive statements just to counterbalance one negative statement" (Willard Tate). In a book entitled *Traits of a Healthy Family,* the number one trait listed was effective communication. The Bible has been telling us to do this all along.

The Apostle Paul writes in Ephesians 4:29, "Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear" Then Ephesians 4:32 explains, "Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you." And in Colossians 4:6, "Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you ought to answer each

Doug's Discussion

In the Presence of Greatness

I think a lot of people have the idea that they wish Jesus was still walking the earth. I'll admit it, I'm one of them. I just think it would be so cool to see Jesus in that way, maybe even witness a miracle or two. Jesus would probably tell me to just be glad of the time I live in now, reminding me that He once said "It is for your good that I am going away. Unless I go away the Counselor will not come to you" (John 16:7). So yeah, having the Spirit-inspired complete Word of God is great. But can you even imagine literally walking with Jesus? Wow.

Of course, in practice that's not something that everyone enjoyed. Jesus wasn't big on hypocrisy and He wasn't afraid to publicly call people out on it. I think there were a few Jewish leaders who wished Jesus lived a little further away. Jesus knew all the intimate and embarrassing details of everyone's life – and there was a woman at a well who was very keen to change the subject. And then there was the incident with demons and pigs in Matthew 8. After being cast out the demons possess the pigs who dive to their deaths in the lake. Then "the whole town went out to meet Jesus. And when they saw him, they pleaded with him to leave their region" (Matthew 8:34). These people LITERALLY asked Jesus to go away.

There are several who think having Jesus around like He used to be would be a great thing. But I suspect some of those people would quickly grow uncomfortable were Jesus actually standing before them. God in the flesh was an overwhelming experience. Even the apostle Peter begged at first: "Go away from me Lord; I am a sinful man!" (Luke 5:8). So . . . do I think it would be great to be in the presence of Jesus? Yes. I also think it would be overwhelming and humbling. I missed out on this experience on earth – but I still think I need to be prepared. Someday every knee will bow before our Lord and Savior. On that day some will wish they were anywhere else. Others will be filled with awe. What will being in the presence of the Savior be like for you?
