God Keeps His Word

Today is the first day of spring! I knew it would come, although there was no guarantee you or I would see it (Jm. 4:14), but the Bible teaches us there is an order to God's seasons and spring will come; it always follows winter. Gen 8:22 teaches, "While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease."



Then Solomon reminds us in Song of Solomon 2:11-12, "for behold, the winter is past; the rain is over and gone. The flowers appear on the earth, the time of singing has come, and the voice of the turtledove is heard in our land." Solomon explains that winter will always give way to spring. Soon the flowers will be budding, the bees will be buzzing, and we will be enjoying the sun and warmer weather.

There are some who say that regular seasons will stop, and no one will be able to tell summer from winter or fall from spring, but I do not believe that. Sometimes there are extremes in the weather, but the order of the seasons remains the same. The Bible teaches we will have seasons – as long as the earth remains.

Notice, the warning of Gen. 8:22, "while the earth remains". The earth and all creation look so permanent, but it is not always going to be here. Peter in 2 Pt. 3:10 gives us another warning, "But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a roar, and the heavenly bodies will be burned up and dissolved, and the earth and the works that are done on it will be exposed."

One day there will be no seasons, no sky, no earth, and no other works of God as we know it. On that day we will all be transformed, given new bodies (1 Cor. 15:40-49). Those who are found faithful will go on to live with the Savior and those who are not righteous will be condemned (John 5:28-29).

As we move into spring it is a reminder that God always keeps His promises, just as winter always gives way to spring, this earth will pass away and give way to eternity.

This being true how should we respond? Peter answers this question for us in 2 Pt. 3:11-13, "Since all these things are thus to be dissolved, what sort of people ought you to be in lives of holiness and godliness, waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set on fire and dissolved, and the heavenly bodies will melt as they burn! But according to his promise we are waiting for new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells."

God always keeps His word. Just as He promised spring would come after winter, He has promised eternity will come after this life, are you ready for that day?

P.M. Sermon: Doug Wells Faith Greater Than Facts

Scripture Reading: Romans 4:18-21

Doug's Discussion

Aaron, Unlikely Servant

Aaron was in total disgrace. For one thing, he made an idol in clear view of God. As far as I know the presence of God was still burning on the mountain when this idol was made, but at the very least a dazzling display of God's mighty power was in their very recent past. Yet Aaron listened when the people requested that other gods be made to go before them. He thought himself skillful enough to craft a god. And that's bad. Perhaps even worse is the utterly ridiculous reply Aaron comes up with when Moses asks him to explain himself. It's found in Exodus 32:24 "they gave me the gold, and I threw it into the fire, and out came this calf!" Okay, if I catch a kid in wrongdoing that child is in trouble. But if they try to talk their way out of it with a completely see-through lie like this one they are in extra trouble. Aaron is in total disgrace.

Not long after this Aaron is brought forward. He is anointed with oil like kings would one day be. Garments of dignity and splendor have been prepared for him. A tunic, sash, robe, and ephod. The breastpiece he wears contains precious stones representing the tribes of Israel. I can't imagine the beauty of this moment, when these precious garments are placed upon him for the first time. I'm sure it was considered an incredible honor. I know it marked the beginning of prestigious service to the Lord. This was all for Aaron, the maker of the golden calf. The inventor of one of the worst excuses for sin I have ever heard.

I bring this up because I think some people believe that a mistake disqualifies them from God's service. And sure, it might be a whopper of a transgression, and probably is if you feel that way. However, having taken a look at Aaron's life, I'm prepared to say you're wrong. Do you need to repent? Yes. You should do that. Might the service you're able to do change based on what you did wrong? Also yes, and it wouldn't be hard to think of some examples. But do not be discouraged to the point of giving up! Our God can still use you to accomplish important things in His service. He took a lying idolater and made him high priest. Just think what He can do with you.
