## Doug's Discussion

## <u>Grandma Boone</u>

My last living grandparent, Virginia Wells Boone, passed away a couple of weeks ago. She was a wonderful lady. When I interviewed family members to find neat things to share about her at the funeral, I learned all kinds of stuff I didn't know. What I knew, from childhood on, was that



she made absurdly good pies. What I didn't know was that she went to college in her 40s to become an EMT for the little town of Quinwood, WV. I didn't know that she paid for other people's groceries when they were short at the cash register in the supermarket. I also didn't know that she dove over her little brother as a child when the tire swing broke so the log chain that was holding it up would land on her back and not on his head. Yes, she was special and certainly will be missed.

My grandmother was ninety when she died and lived a good long life. She outlived two husbands in fact. However, even ninety felt far too soon. She had a stroke and was gone a couple of days later. I admit I was shocked that it was so fast. This woman once broke her leg and walked on it for a week before being convinced to go to the doctor! But that just goes to show you how temporary this life is, and how sudden our departure can be, no matter how tough we are. "As for man, his days are like grass; as a flower of the field, so he flourishes. When the wind has passed over it, it is no more, and its place acknowledges it no longer" (Psalm 103:15-16). My grandma flourished, she blessed many with the beauty of her life, and now she is, sadly (for me and many others), gone from this earth.

We do not know the day or the hour. Consider this well when you think about how appreciative you are of the wonderful people that God has put into your life. As you eat the impossibly good pie they made for you, be sure to thank them and tell them how much you love them. After all, this could be your last chance on earth to do so. If there is something unresolved or unforgiven, why not take the time today to go work it out, as far as it depends on you? Jesus teaches that this should take precedence over even leaving gifts to God at the altar: "If therefore you are

offering your gift at the altar, and, there remember that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift there before the altar. First go and be reconciled to them; then come and offer your gift" (Matthew 5:23-24). After all, this could be your last day on earth to do so. We really just never know do we? The wind of Psalm 103 will pass over everyone. Know this – and treat people like the precious gifts they are, in the precious time you have here to do so. That . . . and be a little sad you never got a piece of my grandma's lemon meringue pie.

## Jesus Stomps Stumpers


People without faith will sometimes point to some stumper of a question to justify denying God or His Word. "If God is so good, why is there suffering?" Or it could be a Bible objection like, "The Bible talks about Hittites, but no one has found anything from a Hittite, so this much be a myth!" After finding the capital of the Hittites, people don't use this one anymore, but you get the idea.

In Jesus's time, the Sadducees had a stumper that helped them in their belief that there couldn't be a resurrection: What if there are seven brothers and a woman is married to all seven of them? When they are all raised, whose wife will she be? (I picture them snickering after asking this. See? Your faith is silly.)

But hear this now: There are no stumpers to God. Jesus basically tells them in Matthew 22:29 that they are being ridiculous. "You are in error because you do not know the Scriptures or the power of God." If there is something in the way of our faith, the same is true today. Walk past whatever barrier there is between you and God, get to know Him better, and your objections will melt away.

All stumpers look ridiculous in the presence of Jesus.
