

Doug's Díscussíon

Two Sídes of Holíness

Fire can be scary, and it can be wonderful. We have a fireplace in our basement that our family thoroughly enjoys. We are blessed by its heat and light. But if fire isn't respected (like that incident I recently had with our burn pile . . . which I am too embarrassed to tell you about) it can be a scary thing. Fire can cause all sorts of damage if you are not careful. Isn't it interesting that the same thing can be both a great blessing and extremely dangerous? Perhaps it is also interesting that the Bible says, "Our God is a consuming fire" (Hebrews 12:29).

In context, Hebrews says that we ought to worship God acceptably because of this. We ought to be reverent while being thankful for the incredible blessings that are given to believers. When we come to God in this way, the results are good. Failing to do so is dangerous. Take, for example, the ark of God as it traveled along the road. Certainly, this ark was a fire – and, for a time, it wasn't handled properly. When fire isn't handled properly accidents happen, and in one occurrence a man named Uzzah paid the price. This leads David to be afraid of the fire, and he says, "How can I ever bring the ark of God to me?" (1 Chronicles 13:12). The ark goes to the house of Obed-Edom, and "the Lord blessed his household and everything he had" (13:14). Because, of course, fire is also wonderful.

We cannot even imagine the great blessings that are in store for those who humbly respect the Word of God; for those who seek to be holy as God is holy. They will enjoy God's light forever! But what of those who approach God casually; who "play around" with the idea of God and with matters of salvation? Well, I wouldn't suggest playing around with fire. I almost blew up my gasoline can one time with this kind of carelessness. Wait . . . I said I wasn't going to tell you about that. My point is that it was very dangerous. How much more dangerous it is to mess around with powers far greater! I wouldn't suggest so much as misusing God's name. I certainly wouldn't suggest trying to live on your own term and thinking that you're not going to get burned. No . . . go back to the Word of God and obedience to God, and there you'll be blessed.

Bíble Call December 2022

We had OVER 14 hours of teaching over the Bible Call line in December. In November, we had 17 hours of lessons on calls. November had 147 calls, and December had 109 calls. High days for November and December were both 13 calls. Over 20 times people listened to the same lesson again. Some of the most called topics were:

Often, people start with things of personal interest and then move on to other topics. THE BIBLE HAS THE ANSWERS FOR LIFE HERE AND LEADING INTO ETERNITY.

Usually, November and December are the low months for calls, and we do not mail as much at that time. We look forward to the New Year and what we can do to reach out with the Gospel. Other congregations are taking advantage of what Camden is making available. The congregation in Hinton has made the mailing of that area with 3024 mailed the first week of January 2023, the Spencer congregation mailing 2785 the second week of January, and our mailing 2500 in town the third week of January. Also, congregations in Ohio have requested more leaflets to hand out. I look for opportunities to talk with more congregations about this work and how they can be involved.
