

# Doug's Discussion

# <u>Goals Our Children See</u>



David had it in his heart to build the temple for God, but the completion of this was not his task. In fact, this particular good work would not even be completed in his lifetime. His son, Solomon, would be the one to undertake the massive (for the time) construction. However, David was wise enough to lay the groundwork for a victory he would never see. David says in 1 Corinthians 22:5, "My son Solomon is young and inexperienced, and the house built for the Lord should be of great magnificence and fame and splendor in the sight of all the nations. Therefore I will make preparations for it." David certainly did that! Hundreds of thousands of talents of silver and gold are stored, along with more iron and bronze than could be

measured. Temple sites were surveyed. Workers were lined up. As the Word says, "David made extensive preparations before his death." All this for something he wanted to see himself but didn't actually get to see.

I think it's fair to say that some good works may not be accomplished by us, or maybe not even in our lifetimes. We want to see them happen, and we dream about it, but they may be a long time in coming. What role are we willing to play to make some of these wonderful things happen? Take for example someone coming to the Lord and giving their life over to God in baptism. What a glorious moment! This is also a moment that may not happen all at once. It may take a lot of time and a lot of work behind the scenes. Would you be willing to work with little to no recognition to help bring about some wonderful thing in the future that you may or may not see? Sometimes someone has to be invited to church six or seven times before they actually come. Would you be willing to be guy number #2? It's like being forty-seven names down in the movie credits. Yeah! Assistant to the make-up artist for the backup! Sure, there's not much glory in that, but it's part of something great.

I would love to see Camden Avenue have four hundred people. The parking lot might get interesting at that point – but we could figure it out. Now, does that kind of thing happen all at once? Of course not. Perhaps it wouldn't even happen in my lifetime. But that doesn't mean there aren't a lot of things we can do to make "extensive preparations" for this dream! If we are willing, if we have a good heart like David, we can begin working now for a dream we might never see. The house of the Lord should be as magnificent as we can make it, amen? Today we can learn effective ways of reaching out to the world. We can experiment with different ministries. We can train people. We can gather lost sheep one by one. Maybe we don't see the completion of such a large goal – but maybe our children do! And that's worth all our efforts.

# Bible Call Report - January 2023

We had OVER 16 hours of teaching over the Bible Call line in JANUARY. In December there were 109 calls with 221 in January. The most calls per day in December were 13 and in January there were 21 in one day. Over 28 times people listened to the lesson again. Some of the most called topics were:

- (13) 126 The Secret of Contentment
- (10) 111 Loneliness and What To Do About it.
- (5) 110 Overcoming Worry
- (4) 115 Overcoming Depression, 950 Exorcism And Demon Possession,
  - 113 Beverage Alcohol Destroys, 203 Facing an Operation, 854 Peanut Butter

Often people start with things of personal interest and then move on to other topics. THE BIBLE HAS THE ANSWERS FOR LIFE HERE AND LEADING INTO ETERNITY.

We have regular requests for printed copies of the lessons and weekly Bible courses to grade and have called on individuals to enroll in other studies.

Other congregations are taking advantage of what Camden is making available. In January, the Hinton congregation made the mailing of that area with 3024 mailed the first week of January 2023, the Spencer congregation mailed 2785 the second week of January, and our mailing in town of 2500 the third week of January. Also, Hopewell mailed their area. Congregations in Ohio have requested more leaflets to hand out. I look for opportunities to talk with more congregations about this work and how they can be involved. In February, we have scheduled another mailing in the Spencer area and also another mailing in town to the 26101 zip code.
