

Doug's Discussion

Words that Make Light

How many messages do you think you hear on any given day? Counting them all up could be a tricky thing, but give it a go. How many voices on the television do you hear that are trying to persuade you of something? How many coworkers or friends or family members apply pressure in small ways with their words to encourage you to think and act in certain ways? How many religious voices are out there speaking to you of the "right way to go"? Honestly, I think it can all be a little overwhelming. We are all bombarded with noise. So take a minute. Hear God when He says, "Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth" (Psalm 46:10).

There IS a God – the maker of heaven and earth. The true ruler of all the nations. Wouldn't it be a shame if we let all the noise drown out the voice that we needed to hear the most? Take a moment and consider the power that is contained is the voice that we sometimes fail to focus on. Words from this voice created light! This same voice can continue to do so today: "For God, who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ" (2 Corinthians 4:6). There is a God who has a voice that contains transformative power in the lives of those who are able and willing to listen to it.

Plenty of wise advice has been given to me in my lifetime, quite a bit of it from my mother. Some of it I listened to, and some of it I didn't until later. Sometimes I would find a voice I would rather listen to instead. After all, there are so many voices! And who do I have to blame when something goes horribly wrong due to my failure to listen? Only myself. The wisest voice of all is the voice we hear any time someone reads from the Word of God. Take a minute. Step away from all the other messages that are competing for attention. None of the other voices have the power that this one does. Will you be still and listen? Will you be changed by the power that can make light shine in your heart? If darkness remains we only have ourselves to blame




Sermon Notes

Let Us Worship God with Reverence

"Let all the earth the; Let all the inhabitants of the stand in of Him. For He, and it was done; He, and it, "Psalm 33:8-9
1: To this day the Jewish people will not write out the name of God, out of reverence for the name (Exodus 20:7). How far are we removed from that kind of thinking?
2: If we would respect Da Vinci for his artistry, how much should we revere the work of God? (What are some examples?)

7: What is a good reason for you to focus this week on being more in awe of God?

Never Compromíse, Never Surrender!

Compromise can be a good thing, but not when it comes to your faith - as tempting as it can be sometimes. I'm sure Daniel and his friends were tempted. In an enemy nation they are told what to eat. The easy thing to say is, "Yes, sir, and thank you for giving me anything to eat at all!" The problem is, eating this food would be against Jewish law. But who would possibly have the courage to refuse? Daniel 1:8 tells us about someone who does: "Daniel resolved not to defile himself with the royal food and wine."

He just won't do it. God shows Daniel so much favor, and I think we can see why. He won't compromise his faith - even if it gets him killed. Even if it means he will be getting only vegetables and water for the foreseeable future. Depending on how you feel about vegetables you might view this as worse than death - but Daniel sticks to the diet so he can honor God.

I encourage you to be inspired. Sometimes there's a lot of pressure to give in and just go along with the crowd - even if they're doing something that goes against your faith in God. Don't. God shows His favor to those who put Him first.
