Doug's Discussion

Coincidence or Judgement?

A few days ago, a Turkish lawmaker stood up to make a speech in parliament. At the age of fifty-three, he delivered an attack on Israel, which ended with a curse. His remarks concluded with: "If only you could be saved from the torment of history, you cannot be saved from the wrath of Allah. Salutations to you all." After saying the last word of his speech, this man dropped to the ground on live television. Doctors believe he had a heart attack. I'm sorry to say he died two days later. The speech and the dramatic fall to the ground immediately afterward are easy to find and see for yourself online.

Heart attacks are not newsworthy. They happen every day. What has captured the imagination of many people around the world is the timing of the event. It is odd that someone would be struck down seconds after an Islamic curse on the descendants of Abraham. A people who had an ancestor who was once told: "I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you" (Genesis 12:3). How much has that blessing faded in this time of the new covenant? I think Romans 11 would caution us against saying this blessing is entirely gone. Verses 28-29 say that the Israelite people are "loved on account of the patriarchs, for God's gifts and his call are irrevocable." OR you could say that this whole thing with the lawmaker is a coincidence due to the man's poor health and the stress of standing before a government body where the majority party currently disagrees with him.

I'll leave conclusions on modern history up to you. I only have two things to say about the matter; it reminds me of something, and I hope it reminds everyone of something. What this reminds me of is an event recorded in Acts 12. A ruler named Herod stood in front of people wearing royal robes, and the people called him a god. Herod accepted that praise, refusing to give glory to God. That choice had immediate consequences. Acts 12:23 says, "Immediately, because Herod did not give praise to God, an angel of the Lord struck him down, and he was eaten by worms and died." Well . . . that's not pleasant, but it leads me to what I hope everyone is reminded of. God is a very loving and patient God, but the judgment of God is something that actually happens. One day everyone will be judged. Those who are not in Christ will be repaid for all the wrong they have done in this life. I think that future reality is sometimes hinted at by things that happen in the present. Maybe the case of this Turkish lawmaker was a coincidence, maybe not. I don't know. But I do know that God will judge the world, down to even evil thoughts and ideas. Being reminded of that, and letting that reminder turn you toward what is right, would not be a bad thing.

The apostle speaks directly to the life we once led—consumed by drunkenness, revelry, and drinking. It calls us to break away from the patterns of our past, choosing sobriety as a conscious decision to live in alignment with God's will.

"Abstain from every form of evil" (1 Thess 5:22). This Scripture delivers a concise yet potent message, instructing us to abstain from every form of evil. This encompasses not only the act of drinking but also the potential harm and moral implications that can arise from the influence of alcohol. Choosing a life free from the intoxicating grip of beverage alcohol grants us clarity of mind and spirit. It allows us to fully immerse ourselves in God's presence, embracing peace and wisdom rather than the temporary euphoria offered by drinks. Sobriety isn't merely the absence of alcohol; it's a conscious decision to live abundantly in God's grace. It's a commitment to mental acuity, emotional stability, and spiritual clarity—a state that allows us to navigate life's challenges with unwavering faith and resilience. In a world where the allure of alcohol is often disguised as a remedy for stress or a means of celebration, let us remember the deeper peace found in choosing sobriety. It's a lifestyle that aligns with God's plan for our well-being, offering a haven of peace amidst the chaotic currents of life. May we find solace in the clarity of a sober mind, embracing the peace that surpasses understanding as we walk this journey guided by faith and wisdom, shunning the evils that lurk within the grasp of beverage alcohol.
