

CURRY CONNECTION

I Am Not Ashamed!

You wake up tomorrow in your warm, soft bed and roll over to see a prescription bottle resting on your nightstand. You remain still as you ponder, "I do not remember leaving one of my medicines out on the nightstand." This bottle looked different, too, and it was a different color than your other medication bottles. You look at the label, and it reads, "The Cure for Cancer." The name of the person to whom it was prescribed was written as "Everyone." Shocked, you wonder if this is real and carry the bottle into the living room where the news is broadcasting, "The Cure is Here!" You learn that what you possess really is the cure for cancer. Oh, how many lives you could now save! There is no stopping you as in your mad rush, you race outside, jump in your vehicle, and go off to the hospital. You go to find all those who are sick with cancer. You have the cure. You want to share it with all, and you are not ashamed!

"For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, 'The just shall live by faith'" (Rom 1:16-17 NKJV).

The truth is that you do not possess a cure for cancer. (Though I wish we did!) However, you have the cure for something much worse: a disease which has a 100% death rate. Sin! The Bible says the reward for sin is death, but the gift of God is life. "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Rom 6:23). This gift of eternal life is contained in the word of God (Jas 1:21), and we have it to preach to all who will listen. Let us get excited about our great opportunity to help save the lost. Teach them of the word and how they can have their sins washed from them (Acts 22:16). When you wake up tomorrow, look over to where your Bible lays, the prescription from the Good Physician, and go to the sin-sick.

MINUTE OF MEDITATION

Snowflake

Let's take a minute to ponder the beauty of a snowflake. Each delicate flake is as unique as a fingerprint. In its existence, it whispers of God's great craftsmanship. The book of Job marvels at God's mastery, asking, "Have you entered the storehouses of the snow?" (Job 38:22). Like these storehouses, God's wisdom and creativity are beyond measure. He paints the wintry landscape with individualized works of art, teaching us about His attention to detail. Just as the snowflake gently blankets the earth, so does God's grace, offering renewal and transformation. Isaiah reminds us of God's promise: "Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow" (Isaiah 1:18). The cold of winter brings a reminder of God's cleansing power, washing away our sins and offering us a fresh start. As you behold the beauty of a snowflake, remember God's unique design for your life. Doug's Discussion

Sand is Slippery

People today, in my experience, are generally not impressed by slippery slope arguments. It seems that almost every use of the concept is viewed as a logical fallacy. "Oh, you THINK doing this will lead to this and this and then this really bad thing, but clearly you're just being dramatic." And hey, that might be true of some claims. If I tell my kid that eating a piece of candy before dinner will inevitably lead to them having bad eating habits, leading to them becoming obese by the age of twenty-five, then yeah . . . maybe I went too far there. But that doesn't mean ALL claims that one step can lead to cascading failures and then leading to a horrible disaster are wrong. Sometimes, one step is all it takes to begin a slide down into a moral abyss.

My wife and I watched a movie the other day that explored the idea of what a theology teacher from the 1800s would think if he somehow time-traveled and saw the state of American society today. Needless to say he wasn't terribly impressed. The apathy in church services bothered him, the lack of commitment to marriage disturbed him, and what was visible on television floored him. I... think that's about right. Someone coming from a place where women showing their ankles was a little bit questionable is definitely going to have problems with us. But how did we get here? How did we get to the place where the Lord's name is taken in vain twenty times per television show and posters of half-naked women are on full display at Walmart? I think the answer is: little by little. Down the slope we went.

Psalm 11:3 asks, "When the foundations are being destroyed, what can the righteous do?" Somewhere along the way, we made the monumental choice to take a step away from the foundation of the truth of God's Word. Those foundations have been attacked by the world for years, and many have questioned them. For many, the Word is no longer looked at as a guide for truth and morality. That decision led to compromises in morality: Small ones at first, larger ones later. People started building on sand instead of building on the rock. Eventually, this leads to disaster and disgrace. "Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a disgrace to any people" (Proverbs 14:34). Can a slippery slope argument be false? Sure. If a toothpaste commercial says failing to buy their product will lead you to lose all your teeth, I think you can safely ignore them. But when Proverbs 13:13 says, "He who scorns instruction will pay for it," I suggest you pay attention and watch your step. God is just trying to save you from sliding into disaster.
