Doug's Discussion

See the Spiritual

What do you think would happen if you suddenly got a glimpse into the unseen spiritual world? All we see with our eyes, of course, is the material. This has led some to the unwise conclusion that the material is all that there is. But what if, for one second, the dividing curtain was torn and you beheld a deeper reality? In that moment you could see tempting demons and reassuring angels. In the moment you could see the state of the souls of people. Perhaps you even catch a fleeting glimpse of the Spirit of God hovering over the face of the waters. I imagine that such a moment would be terrifying. Such a moment would also be more real, more true, than anything that is normally witnessed by sight.

One day a select few disciples had such a moment. On a normal day Jesus looked like a regular guy. Isaiah predicted, "He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him" (Isaiah 53:2). But was he just a regular looking man? Multiple signs and wonders would tell any honest heart otherwise. People forget quickly though, and when he wasn't making blind people see he just looked like anyone else. But not on the day Peter, James and John went up a mountain. The truth is that Jesus was NOT just a man, and that human exterior concealed enormous divine power. On that mountain the Bible says, "There [Jesus] was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as the light. Just then there appeared Moses and Elijah, talking with Jesus" (Matthew 17:2-3). Can you imagine? The sun is mighty bright. This was so terrifying that Peter started blabbering without his brain being engaged, and I don't blame him. He just got a glimpse into the spiritual world.

We live in the material world, what we see is the material world, but as Christians we are not of the material world. Don't let this place lull you into a spiritual sleep! Though we can only see the underlying spiritual world by faith, "We live by faith, not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7). On the mountain God told those frightened disciples that they should listen to Jesus. Unlike Moses and Elijah, Jesus was the Son of God, evidenced by the searing light shining from His momentarily revealed face. Remember this: if you could see the world as it really is it would straighten you right up. You would live with correct priorities and you would serve the Almighty God. So see it! Look not just at the material, but dig deep into the Word until you can see the more important spiritual things. The devil temps us with the whole world but Jesus is God's beloved Son. Listen to Him!

Depth of God's Love

Let's take a minute to immerse ourselves in the depth of God's love — a love so vast that it transcends understanding and defies limitations. In Ephesians 3, we're encouraged to comprehend the width, length, height, and depth of God's love, surpassing our human grasp.

God's love, uncontainable and unchanging, is the foundation of our faith. Romans 8:38-39 assures us that nothing can separate us from His love—neither height nor depth nor anything in all creation. God's love is freely given to all. John 3:16 encompasses this truth: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life" (John 3:16 NKJV). Let's dwell in God's love, allowing it to shape our thoughts and actions. May this boundless love be our anchor, guiding us through life's storms and illuminating our paths with hope and grace. Allow His love to lead you to salvation through His word.

CURRY CONNECTION

God Is Always Listening

In Acts chapter 10, we have Cornelius, a centurion. The Scripture calls him "(A) devout man and one who feared God with all his household, who gave alms generously to the people, and prayed to God always" (Acts 10:2 NKJV). The Scripture compliments Cornelius well but does not name him as being saved or as being a disciple of Christ. (That is to come at the end of this chapter.) In Cornelius' description the Bible says that he prayed to God always. What would be of these prayers to God coming from a lost soul? An angel will shortly appear to Cornelius and say the following, "...Your prayers and your alms have come up for a memorial before God" (Acts 10:4). Here in Acts chapter 10, we have an example of a man who is not in a saved condition, but his prayers are heard. His acts of charity are observed and accepted by God. Yet, he still was not saved. He needed the gospel spoken to him, so Peter was sent so Cornelius could hear, believe, repent, confess Christ, and be baptized for the remission of sins. This fact that God heard Cornelius' prayers further proves there is no such thing as a sinner's prayer for salvation.

However, we have heard of some teaching that God cannot hear the prayers of the lost. If we claim God cannot hear the prayers of the lost, then we have limited His all-knowing ability or omniscience. "And there is no creature hidden from His sight, but all things are naked and open to the eyes of Him to whom we must give account" (Heb 4:13).

The most common Scripture I have witnessed people claim God cannot hear the prayer of the lost comes from John 9:31. "Now we know that God does not hear sinners; but if anyone is a worshiper of God and does His will, He hears him" (John 9:31). In this Scripture's context Jesus had just recently healed a blind man. Now, the blind man is being questioned by the Jews, and the blind man gives this statement. The one speaking here, the blind man, is not inspired and is capable of saying something incorrect like this, or the blind man could have meant that God does not heed sinners.

We know God can hear the prayers of the lost, such as Cornelius, and the best way to understand God's ear to prayer is that He can hear but will not always listen or heed. "Behold, the Lord's hand is not shortened, That it cannot save; Nor His ear heavy, That it cannot hear. But your iniquities have separated you from your God; And your sins have hidden His face from you, So that He will not hear" (Isa 59:1-2).

We can see the error in taking the position of God not hearing the lost in the conversion of the apostle Paul. In Acts 9:9, 11, we can read that Paul had been praying for three days, and Jesus heard him. If we take the position that God can only hear the saved, then we must also say Paul was saved at this point before Paul's baptism, just as those who deny the essential act of baptism for the remission of sins. The correct way to put it is that God does not heed the prayers of a sinner. He can certainly hear the message but, due to their unrighteousness, will not give an audience to the message. "Therefore I also will act in fury. My eye will not spare nor will I have pity; and though they cry in My ears with a loud voice, I will not hear them" (Ezek 8:18).
