Bíble Questíon! <u>Why Does the Church Not Use the Títle 'Father' for Its Leaders?</u>

I was asked, "Why does the church not use the title 'Father' for its leaders? This is my response to this question.

If anyone speaks, let him speak as the oracles of God. If anyone ministers, let him do it as with the ability which God supplies, that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom belong the glory and the dominion forever and ever. Amen. (1 Peter 4:11 NKJV)

It is the desire for Christians to adhere as closely as possible to the words of the Father, as did Jesus (John 12:50). When we align ourselves with the Scripture, we avoid moving away from the doctrine of Christ and substituting it with our own. If we depart from the doctrine of Christ, then we do not have God (2 John 9). We have seen this even during the Restoration Movement, which celebrated the mindset of sticking to the Scriptures for all authority. You might remember this slogan: "Let us Do Bible Things in Bible Ways and Call Bible Things by Bible Names." This slogan states a biblical truth that was not only followed by those during the Restoration but also in the early church, which we read of in our New Testaments.

Proper vocabulary is important in the Lord's church. Corrupt vocabulary has been seen to lead to corrupt practices. Corrupt vocabulary grows thanks to an incomplete or flawed understanding of vocabulary in the Bible. So let the faithful study to show themselves approved to God. Corrupt vocabulary is worthless and can cause troublesome issues that give no edification, and we have been warned in the Scripture against corrupt communication (Eph 4:29).

As for using the title "Father," there is nothing wrong in thinking of those men who have led you into the kingdom or shepherded you as being fathers through the gospel. This is the same sense in which Paul puts it. "For though you might have ten thousand instructors in Christ, yet you do not have many fathers; for in Christ Jesus I have begotten you through the gospel" (1 Cor 4:15). Christian leaders who lead well are as fathers who have begotten us through the gospel, like the apostle Paul. So, in a sense, they are father figures (1 Cor 4:14, 1 Tim 1:2, 2 Tim 1:2, Titus 1:4) but only by the authority "in Christ Jesus." Paul is careful to say where the authority lies "in Christ Jesus" and "through the gospel," as he, as a father, encourages the Corinthian brethren to repent.

What the Scripture teaches against is using "Father" as a religious title or one of authority, as seen in some denominations today. "Do not call anyone on earth your father; for One is your Father, He who is in heaven" (Matt 23:9). In this context, Jews were content with the authority or judgment of the rabbi, and Jesus is teaching not to use religious titles that give men undue authority. We see why Jesus warned us of this because we have seen this to be true in the history of denominations that have used "Father" titles of authority. In some religions, they were given the right to forgive sins, to contradict Scripture, etc. The correct usage of "Father" boils down to using the word in the correct sense. Corrupt vocabulary is seen to lead to corrupt practices. Let us abide in His word and not our own.

DOUG'S DISCUSSION

The Location of Enough

I've always enjoyed visiting mature Christian people. I don't always have the opportunity to do so, of course, because, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick" (Matthew 9:12). Some very wise person said that once. But, when a mature Christian has a bad day, and you think they might just be in desperate need because of it, you will often be surprised. You ask something like, "Hey, is there anything that I can do for you?" And they often will say, "Thank you, but I have everything I need." Yes, they will sometimes appreciate the dinner you bring over and will always appreciate your prayers, but their souls are at peace. As hard as their life may be, they don't look like they are in want. And how different that is from the people who are ALWAYS in want! Whose hearts are always empty and they are always hungry for something they don't have.

If you are content, you are blessed, and I think I have a pretty good idea how you got there. David once famously said: "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not be in want. He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, he restores my soul" (Psalm 23:1-3). Souls without God are broken and needy. They are in need of restoration. If this describes you, I encourage you to seek out your shepherd. Listen for His voice and follow Him. Jesus says about Himself: "... he brings out his own sheep, he goes before them; and the sheep follow him, for they know his voice" (John 10:4). I pray you are one of these sheep! The paths that you will go on will be good ones. You will finally find what is needed. The green grass, the still waters, and the voice of your Savior will bring you a contentment that you have never known out in the wild. People who come to visit you will recognize the beautiful spiritual state that you are in. Maybe you wouldn't normally be at peace – but you are because Jesus has brought enduring peace to you.

Can you even imagine saying the sentence, "I have enough"? That is so foreign to the mindset of our world today! Even better is the sentence, "I have enough today, and I will have even more later." For believers, this is a true sentence. "You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. Surely goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever" (Psalm 23:5-6). Because I follow the Shepherd I walk in fields of goodness and love. If I choose to keep following until the end, I will come to His eternal house, where the fields are even richer. Do I have enough? I most certainly do. If you don't, I pray you know (and go to) where enough

MINUTE OF MEDITATION

Debt Cancelation

Heard on V96.9 and WVAM 98.1 FM, 107.9 FM, and AM 1450

I have a proposition for Mastercard and Visa. I suggest every seven years or so they cancel everyone's debt. Wouldn't that be wonderful? The bill comes in the mail, and out of nowhere, it says zero instead of whatever unfortunate number it used to say.

Of course, I suspect neither of those companies are going to go for that. They would quickly go bankrupt because of the numerous people who would abuse the policy. But would it interest you to know that there was once a law in Israel that went something like that? It can be found in Deuteronomy 15:1-2: "At the end of every seven years you must cancel debts. This is how it is to be done: Every creditor shall cancel the loan he has made to his fellow Israelite or brother because the Lord's time for canceling debts has been proclaimed."

This old law wouldn't work for Mastercard, but if you wanted to reflect the grace that is found in Christ, it could be practiced by you. Does someone owe you something? You helped them in a hard spot, but they struggled to return the favor. Why not say – "Don't worry about it, your debt is canceled"? After all, praise Jesus, God has done that for us.
