

A Yes Man is Not Always Saying Yes

"No one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will be loyal to the one and despise the other..." (Matthew 6:24 NKJV). It is another busy day at the plant, and the supervisor approaches with a smile. James and the supervisor are good friends and not just co-workers, "Hey buddy, do you care to stay a little late today to get this inventory done?" James returns the smile and says, "Sure thing, buddy! Not a problem!"

James' cell phone is ringing again, and the voice on the other end asks, "Do you care to do this for us? I know this is not normally your thing, but we trust you will be the one to get it done." James always works hard at everything he does and pulls through in the end. So James says, "Yeah, I will get it done for you!" James is known to be the one to get things done. People come to James all the time for this very reason.

James' neighbor now drops in and says, "Hey, I know this is last minute, but this weekend, could you help my friend move?" James has been on the roll of saying "Yes!" all day. "Sure!" James replies, and as his neighbor runs off, he yells back, "That is what I love about you, James! You say yes to everything!"

As the door closed, those words echoed in James' mind: "You say yes to everything!" The truth is that James says no a lot, too. The Christian has the right to say no. "But let your 'Yes' be 'Yes,' and your 'No,' 'No.' For whatever is more than these is from the evil one" (Matthew 5:37). The key is to be able to discern when to say "Yes!" versus "No!" James said "Yes" a lot today, but let us look at what he said no to.

"Yes," to the supervisor to work over, said "No" to James' youngest son, who wanted to play hide and seek before his bedtime. "Yes" to committing to that new thing over the phone, said "No" to Jeanie, who was planning a family activity. "Yes" to helping your neighbor's friend move over the weekend, said "No" to God on Sunday worship. We see that being a "Yes man" is not always saying "Yes" but telling someone else, like your God, your family, or yourself, "No."

Be careful what you are saying yes to. "See then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil." (Ephesians 5:15-16).

Doug's Discussion

What's in Your Storeroom?

One time, as a traveling college student, I, along with a couple of friends, stayed as a guest at a wealthy man's home. This man entertained us by showing us a few of his many treasures. He had the most extensive gun collection I've ever seen. Besides having a field cannon in his living room, he also brought out several handguns and rifles for us to admire. One of those was a handgun taken from a Nazi soldier in his service in WWII! I was later told by someone who attended church with this man that I didn't even see his "good" guns. He kept those locked in a safe, including a gun made of solid gold. That doesn't seem practical, but I'll go with it. I'll tell you one thing . . . anyone attempting to rob that house is likely to regret their life choices, like the choice of bringing a gun to a field cannon fight.

Yes, he was a wealthy man. Yes, he had many treasures. Do you know that you can be wealthier still? Jesus says in Matthew 13:52, "...every teacher of the law who has been instructed about the kingdom of heaven is like the owner of a house who brings out of his storeroom new treasures as well as old." If you know the Old Testament, you have treasure. If you know the New Testament, you have treasure. In fact, these treasures provide us with everything needed for "life and godliness" (2 Peter 1:3). I notice in scripture that Jesus was never particularly concerned with money or worldly goods. He knew that these things, though some might be useful for defending your temporary home (like the field cannon), would pass away. This is one reason why the one who possesses the Word is richer than the rich man. Jesus proclaims, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away" (Matthew 24:35).

If anyone came to my home, I would have no real material treasures of which to speak. Nothing that would impress you. But I pray to God that I can always provide a treasure that is better than any worldly thing for any interested visitor. I pray that "out of my storeroom" I can bring treasures to meet needs and answer the important questions. I pray that I can answer the question of how someone can be saved and how they can live in a way that pleases God. And I pray that you can also bring this kind of treasure to people whenever you have the opportunity to do so. You can? Then those who visit you just enter a home complete with storerooms filled with treasures, new and old.

Mistakes Were Made

Since nobody is perfect, eventually, someone you're close to is going to make a mistake. Let's say they didn't mean to do it. They even apologize afterward.

Maybe this person said something foolish while you were in a conversation with them. Maybe they did something selfish without really thinking about it. Whatever it was, they're sorry. They will try to do better next time. So . . . now what? How will you treat them afterward?

After a public mistake is made, there are some who will treat the offender differently until their dying day. There are people who – once you have offended them, you are now a second-class citizen in their eyes. But I encourage you – don't be like that. That kind of attitude is very discouraging to someone trying to do what is right. Instead, follow 2 Corinthians 2:7, which says: "Now instead, you ought to forgive and comfort him, so that he will not be overwhelmed by excessive sorrow."

Remember – you make mistakes, too. And I'm sure that after you accidentally offend, you would want others to forgive and comfort you. It's only fair to extend this same grace to others.
